## Sportsmen Want Screens Placed In Lake Outlets

Will Crescent lake be saved for Loch Leven trout?

Or will the absence of screens on irrigation ditches leading from the lake through the Tumalo irrigation project, prove an obstacle to large trout?

These are the questions that are stirring local sportsmen to action, and were the cause of Nate Otterbein and Marion J. Barnes, district game warden, interviewing officials of the Tumalo project for the purpose of asking that screens be placed at irrigation ditch outlets.

Establishment of a Loch Leven trout lake, even as Diamond Lake is primarily a Rainbow trout lake, lured the state game officials to plant one half million Loch Leven trout in Crescent lake. It is the hope that the time will come when the lake will yield the same harvest of eggs as is Diamond Lake.

But, District Game Warden Barnes pointed out, unless screens are placed in the outlets to the irrigation ditches, the small trout will make their escape and will not be able to return owing to the heavy current at the outlet.

Whether or not legal pressure will be brought to bear upon the irrigation project officials to construct screens, could not be learned, although it is known that everything within reason will be done to save the Loch Leven trout in Crescent lake.

## Klamath Youth Is Sentenced to Jail

YREKA, Calif., Aug. 11.—While bullets from the rifles of an impromptu posse whined around his ears, Sheriff A. S. Calkins faced Bernard Richter, aged 18 across the great sawdust dump of the Weed Lumber company and up a mountain side near Weed until he cornered him and brought him back to the city, following a brief career of crime engaged in by Richter and which almost cost the youth his life at the hands of enraged Weed citizens.

Richter, who claims Klamath Falls as his home, started to rob punch boards in Weed of money and merchandise until he was discovered. He resorted to flight and by his entrance into a home, he shook off his pursuers; he failed to take advantage of his refuge and attacked the woman into whose home he broke.

Attracted by the woman's screams, the posse again started after Richter and he fled through the city, Sheriff Calkins taking up the chase and caught Richter. Accused by Richter's attack on the woman, members of the posse sought to take Richter away from Calkins but the latter was able to argue the Weed citizens into letting the law take its course.

Richter is held in the county jail, following his sentence of six months by Judge J. P. Bradley at Weed today and a grand jury investigation of his activities will follow.

## Blaze Breaks Out In Timber Stand

Immediate response to a plea for public cooperation in reporting forest fires to the Klamath Forest Protective Association offices during the smoky days when the forest fire lookouts cannot spot the blazes, was made this morning when a fire near Pinehurst was reported by C. D. De Carlo.

The plight of the lookouts in not being able to see from the lofty peaks they are stationed on, and the request of the association for public aid, was carried in a story by the Evening Herald last night.

The fire covered an area of several acres and several association fire fighters were immediately dispatched to extinguish the blaze.

## Everett Firemen Want More Money

EVERETT, Wash., Aug. 12.—Firemen of Everett have presented a request to the city council for an increase of \$25 a month to their salaries. They ask that the scale be placed into effect January 1. The policemen are expected to seek a salary increase.
