Demand Increases For Ford Tractors

Sales reports received by the Ford Motor company from branches throughout the country during the past week show an increased demand for trucks and tractors with retail deliveries exceeding those of last year.

Figures from these reports, which cover the first twenty days of July and which were just given out, give the sales of Ford one-ton trucks as totaling 12,168 an increase of 30 per cent over the same number of days in July last year.

While the greater portion of the truck sales cover industrial installations, there is a noticeable increase in deliveries in rural sections where harvesting of crops is under way or is just beginning. Another feature indicating that farmers are coming into the buying market is increasing numbers of comes in the reports of Fordson tractor sales. Retail deliveries of Fordsons during the first twenty days of July numbered 5,664, an increase of 43 per cent over the same number of days in July a year ago.

In view of these reports and the business conditions they indicate sales during the remaining weeks of the summer will continue, it is anticipated on a high level than ordinarily expected for this season of the year.

SHEVLIN-HIXON GET NEW TRACT

With the time when it will begin manufacturing their Klamath holdings approaching fast, the Shevlin-Hixon lumber company is busily engaged in blocking up its extensive timber holdings near Crescent and yesterday acquired a 160 acre tract from J. E. Tater.

Autos Tangle on New Road Project

Clouds of dust comparable to a London fog resulted in two fender bangles on The Dalles-California highway near Modoc Point yesterday is today's report of J. J. Johnson, state highway inspector.

Ignoring signs warning motorists of resurfacing work in progress, the two motorists secure in the belief that the level macadam would go on forever, plunged into deep dust that so obscured their vision that the accidents occurred.

"And they will continue to occur until the traveling public realizes the danger involved," C. C. Sealey, resident engineer of the state highway department said this morning.

DEMPSEY PEEVED AT JACK KEARNS

Champ Says he Will Refuse to Fight if Manager Doesn't Keep Still

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 17. (AP)—If Jack Kearns persists in his efforts to represent Jack Dempsey in negotiations for a bout with Harry Wills, negro contender, the heavy weight champion will cast aside his gloves and forget about fighting until his present contract with Kearns expires. Dempsey made this clear in a statement to the American Press.

"I understand that Kearns and the New York Boxing Commission are to meet today to have brackets posted for a match for me with Wills.

"I take this means of announcing again to the boxing commission that Kearns has no authority to sign for me and anything done by him in my behalf cannot bind me.

"I state for the last time that I am determined to do my own match making, but reiterate my word to give Kearns his 35 per cent cut during the life of our contract.

"If they go through with their plans today and Mullins signs for Wills, evening Kearns' forfeit, Mullins will loose the match and I will not fight anyone until that contract (the Kearns contract running until September 1926) has expired which will cause Kearns the loss of a few hundred thousand dollars."

Promissory Note Basis of Action

Oakland Engineer Tells of Friction

Friction is defined as the "resistance to motion due to the contact of surfaces." It is one of the many important problem automotive engineers have to combat, and it takes a heavy toll in power that otherwise would be productive, and in wear and tear.

Lubrication is our chief weapon against friction, and proper lubrication reduces friction loss and wear to a minimum. When lubrications 100 per cent, moving metal surfaces do not touch. They are separated by a film of pure oil and the only friction is the rubbing of one layer of this oil film against another layer.

Absolute perfection, however, is difficult to attain, and even when we approximate it in the lubrication systems of the better automobiles, there is another factor remaining. This is the contamination of the lubricant by the entrance of foreign particles.

An automobile engine resembles a human in that it tries "to eat a peck of dirt" during its lifetime. minute particles of dirt and grit are constantly finding their way into the vitals of the engine through the air the carburetor breathes or via the gasoline line. Practically all of this dirt finds its way into the lubricant, either directly or after it is formed into carbon in the cylinders, and then breaks off and mixes with the oil. Naturally these particles of grit break the protective oil film and set up friction that wears cylinder walls, pistons, piston pins, connecting rods and crankshaft bearings.

To overcome this condition the new Oakland Six is equipped with an oil filter. This device has no moving parts and is entirely automatic. It consists of metal mesh and fabric through which the entire supply of engine lubricant passes several times an hour.
