

Cost Of Food Still Mounts

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20.—The retail food index of the bureau of labor statistics of the interior department showed an increase of slightly more than 3 per cent in retail food costs for July as compared with June.

An increase of 11 per cent in all food articles combined was reported for the year ending July 15 as compared with the preceding year.

The average expenditure for food during the month ending July 15 over the preceding month increased in Boston and Providence seven per cent, Milwaukee six; Rochester five; Detroit and Minneapolis 4; Butte, Chicago Omaha and Washington, D. C. 3; Kansas City and Pittsburgh 2; Denver 1, and Los Angeles, Portland, Oregon, San Francisco and Seattle less than .5 of one per cent. In Salt Lake the report showed a decrease of 2 per cent.

Mal-nutrition Held Cause Of Child Defects

Baby Clinic at Henley School Proves Big Success

Tonils, adenoids and malnutrition. These three terms cover the sources of most of the defects of Klamath children under school age. This is the statement today of Miss Lydia Fricke, county health nurse, who has been active in conducting clinics throughout the county during the past few years.

Adenoids and tonils are self-explanatory, Miss Fricke pointed out. Certain defects in talking, hearing and in the function of other organs in the body can be rectified with the extraction of either tonils and adenoids or both.

Malnutrition Important
But it is malnutrition that Klamath mothers should be instructed in. "It isn't that children are not given enough food," Miss Fricke said. "It is the right kind of food. Certain foods build up the bones and muscles. Others do not. It is this ignorance of the reaction of certain foods on the growing child, that causes many minor defects, such as small bones, soft bones and lardy muscular development. Every mother should raise her child on an approved diet in order to assure that child of simultaneous growth of all the functions of the body."

Clinic Successful
Nineteen babies and children under school age were examined yesterday afternoon at a successful clinic staged at the Henley school house for the benefit of mothers residing in Mt. Laki district and Henley district. The clinic was conducted by Dr. C. A. Newcom with the assistance of Dr. P. W. Sharp, Dr. J. R. Barr, and County Health Nurses Lydia Fricke and G. B. McClelland.

OREGON'S CROP REPORT ISSUED

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 20.—The crop report for Oregon issued by the United States department of agriculture for the week ending August 15, follows:

Moderately warm weather prevailed at the beginning of the week, but toward the close it was much cooler, with light frost in some central elevated sections. The change in temperature was accompanied by considerable cloudiness, with heavy showers in a few eastern localities, and light rain over a large part of the state. Rain and higher humidity checked the spread of forest fires, and the heavy smoke which covered a large part of the state last week was cleared away.

Cereals: Most small grain is mature, harvest is over in many places and threshing is making good progress, though it was delayed by rain in places. Irrigated corn is doing well but unirrigated corn generally needs rain. Plowing for fall seeding will make little progress until more rain falls.

Fruits: Apples are dropping somewhat because of lack of moisture. Early winter apples are beginning to show color. Picking of bartlett pears continues. Canning of evergreen blackberries is under way. Some fresh prunes are being shipped.

Meadows, pastures and ranges: Pastures have been somewhat freshened by rain in localities, but are mostly dry. Irrigated alfalfa is doing well, but most second crop clover in unirrigated districts is suffering from drought. Some local delay in haying was caused by showers.

Livestock: Range stock is generally in good condition. Some domestic stock is being fed, and there is complaint of decreasing weight and diminishing flow of milk.

Miscellaneous: Some early hops are being picked; the main crop is generally doing well. Late potatoes where not irrigated have suffered considerably from drought. Broccoli is doing well.
