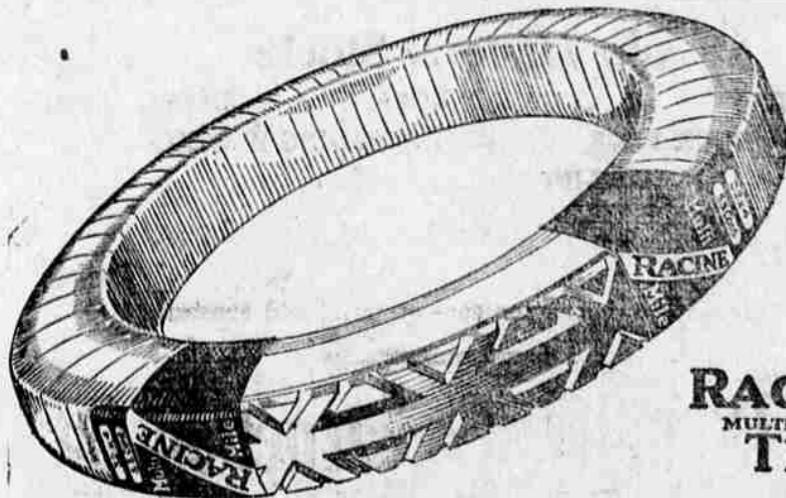
STEBBINS LEFT TODAY
