

Irrigation Is Aid To Butte Valley

(Special to The Herald)

YREKA, Calif., Aug. 25.—How Butte valley is rapidly developing since the opening of the Butte Valley Irrigation district this spring is evinced by the letting of a contract yesterday by the district to A. L. Pulford, of Madroel for the increase in capacity of the Antelope diversion to three times its present capacity. The capacity of the diversion now is approximately 3000 miners' inches. The contract will be completed in 60 days.

Two hundred acres of sugar beets are growing toward a harvest of what is said to be estimated at 10 tons an acre. This is the first crop of beets planted in the valley and the acreage will be heavily increased next year. Now alfalfa is showing up in excellent form.

F. S. Bramwell, manager for the district and who was a Yreka visitor yesterday, said the problem of colonization was being rapidly solved.

"Two families from San Francisco and two more from Boise, Idaho, have bought homes and acreage in the district in the last week," he said. "I leave tomorrow for Los Angeles in response to many inquiries from the Owens valley ranchers and others interested in irrigated farming. The district is being rapidly changed from a veritable desert to a modern and well settled Paradise."

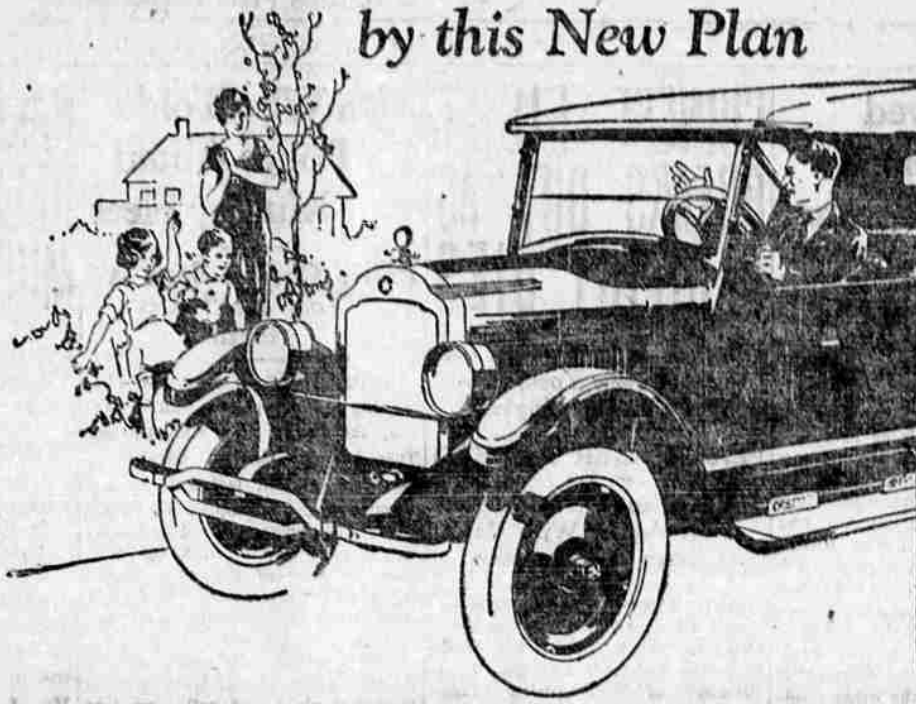
Members of the Forum committee will meet at the chamber of commerce tomorrow at 1:30 to further their plans for the fall meetings.
