## WEED PLANS TO PROTEST GAME WITH PELICANS

### Transfer of Fuller from Dunsmuir Questioned by Team

The Weed will not be downed without fighting to the last ditch was manifest today with the word that the baseball nine has entered a protest against Klamath's victory last Sunday on the ground that the local baseball team "loaded up" players for the crucial test.

The controversy arises over the release of Fuller, Dunsmuir shortstop, to Klamath Falls. With the release of Norwest, former Pelican shortstop, the Pelican infield was considerably weakened. Officials of the team were lucky enough to secure Fuller, considered one of the fastest shortstops in the league. Fuller played a fine game against Weed Sunday which ended in a thrilling victory for Klamath.

#### Told of Protest

Last Sunday, the Klamath team were unofficially notified that the game would be protested if Fuller played. Although no official word of the protest has yet been received from the president of the league, it is known that a protest will be entered.

Several directors of the Pelican nine take the position that no rule was violated in securing Fuller to cork up the leak in the infield.

"Weed has done the same thing that they are crabbing at us about," one director pointed out today. "Earlier in the season, we released a pitcher named Phillips. Weed grabbed him and brought him to Klamath Falls. Phillips pitched them to a victory against the Klamath team. But no kick was heard from anybody on that transfer."

"Then again, White, a Dunsmuir first baseman, was released by Dunsmuir to McCloud and played against Klamath Falls. No protest from our team or from anybody else was entered."

"Now for some reason the Weed team takes exception to the former Dunsmuir shortstop playing with Klamath Falls."

Whether or not the directors of the league will recognize a protest could not be learned today.

## Lamson Knocks Out Crawford

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 26. — Chub Crawford of Washington state college was knocked out last night in the fifth round of a 10 round match by George Lamson, Omaha heavyweight. Lamson knocked Crawford down for nine counts in the second, and also in the third round. Crawford tipped the beam at 211, and Lamson at 158.

Tommy O'Brien, Portland bantam, won a 10 round decision over Danny Edwards, Negro, of Oakland. O'Brien showed great improvement over his first professional appearance here 3 weeks ago when he lost a 10 round bout with Edwards.

"Two names alone in all Detroit's history are associated with the supreme degree of achievement in their respective fields. They are those of Henry Ford and Tyrus Cobb."

"Now therefore, Be it resolved by the Klamath Bar association that a committee of three members be appointed by the president of this association for the purpose of ascertaining the true condition of the civil docket of the circuit court in this county and for the further purpose of devising and recommending ways and means whereby this bar association and the members of the bar generally may assist the said circuit court and the clerk thereof in the more speedy disposition of any and all cases now pending before said court, whether upon motions or demurrers, or for trial upon the merits. And be it

"Further resolved, that they be and are hereby authorized to investigate and report to this association

such recommendations as in their judgment may seem proper in the premises."
