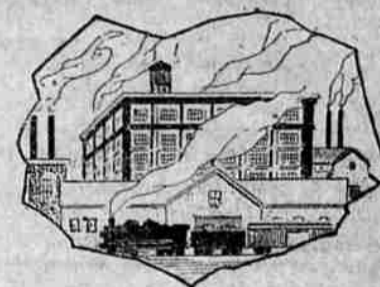
PAVING OF ROAD IN CRATER PARK NOW UNDER WAY
