Coal Mines To Stop All Work At 12 o'Clock

More Than 158,000 Laborers to Lay Down Tools

PHILADELPHIA, Aug. 31.—(AP)—Anthracite mining in North-western Philadelphia will stop at midnight by order of the United Mine Workers. The strike of twelve marks expiration of the two year working contract of 158,000 workers who have been unable to agree with the mine owners upon its renewal and who decline to work until some renewal is negotiated.

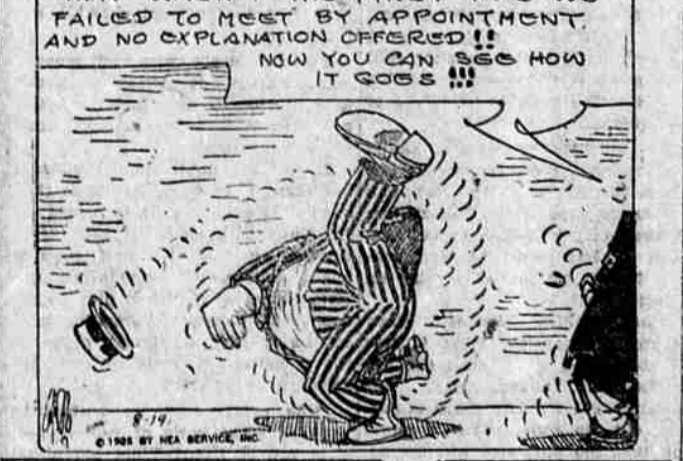
