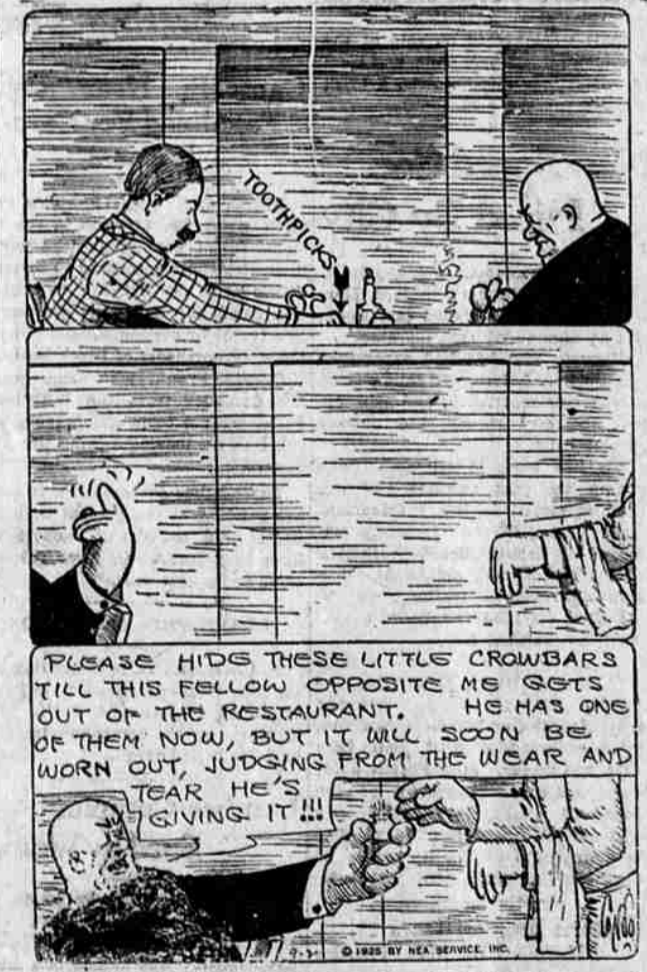

Truth About Air Service Will Be Given to Public
 SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Sept. 3. — Colonel William Mitchell, "Stormy Petrel" of the air service, threw a bombshell into the air service circles today when war department officials began to review his book "Winged Defense," which had been published against war department orders. "The truth about United States air service is going to be suppressed no longer," declared the commander of the eighth corps area air forces to the Associated Press. "I have disobeyed no orders," Colonel Mitchell asserted, although admitting that he published his book without submitting it to his superiors for approval.
