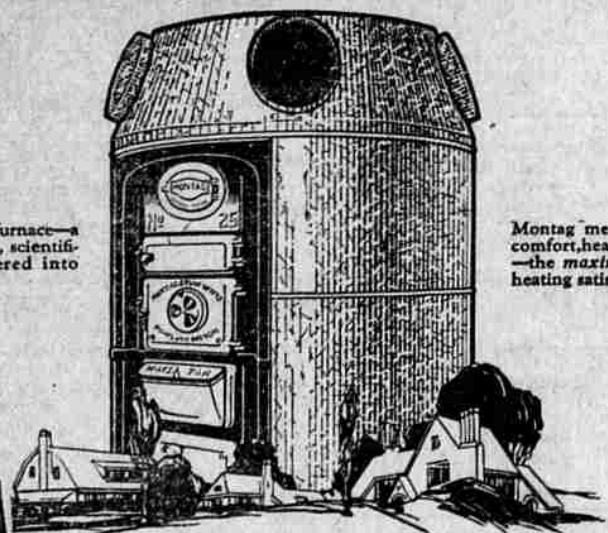

Boy Scouts Of Klamath Want Own Executive

Present By-county Plan Is Not Popular Here

Employment of a paid scout executive who divides his time between Jackson and Klamath counties has proven unsatisfactory, so far as the Klamath scout organization is concerned, was the decision of leaders of the boy scout movement at the chamber of commerce last night.

As a result, it was voted to break away from the bi-county organization, perfect an entirely new association and procure the services of an executive who will devote his entire time to the youth of this county.

Under a six month arrangement with Jackson county, the present organization will be effective until October 15, on which date it will be terminated.

All Klamath officers of the present organization submitted their resignations and a committee headed by Julius Mueller was authorized to prepare plans for a strictly Klamath organization.

Local officers of the bi-county organization who resigned include Jack Kimball, treasurer; J. A. Gordon, vice president; Rev. A. L. Rice, scout commissioner and Julius Mueller, deputy commissioner.

Cecil A. Cook, who has been the paid executive, dividing his time between the two counties, will take up the reorganization plan with scout officials at Spokane next week, it was declared last night.

With Klamath county having a paid executive who will give all of his time to the work, the proponents of the movement believe that the boy scout work here will be given added impetus to make it a real success.
