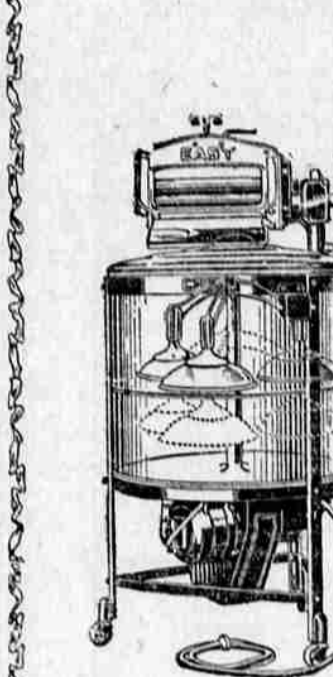

The Reds tightened their grip on third place by trimming the Cubs, 5 to 2. The Yankees lost to the Red Sox 2 to 1. Babe Ruth snapped his streak of consecutive hitting games, stopping at nine.

The White Sox topped the Browns 4 to 3, while the Tigers were humbled by the Indians 8 to 6, in 10 innings.
