State Prison Probe Sought

Salem Newspaper Wants Grand Jury Inquiry

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 18.—The Capital Journal today laid before District Attorney John Carson a demand for an investigation of conditions existing now and prior to the Murray-Whites-Kelly escape from the Oregon state penitentiary by the Marion county grand jury.

The demand came as the result of Governor Pierce's failure to make public the report of his special committee that investigated the break, or to carry out the recommendations supposed to be contained in that report, which is known to recommend the removal of Warden A. M. Dalrymple.
