ACME GARAGE IS TOWING STATION

Is Made Klamath Station for Oregon State Motor Association

With the selection of the Acme Motor Co., Inc., as an official towing and service station in Klamath Falls, members of the Oregon State Motor Association will be extended this additional service when in the Klamath county district. The Acme Motor Co., was selected, and negotiations completed last week when Geo. O. Brangenburg, manager of the Oregon State Motor association, was in Klamath Falls for the purpose of extending the service of the association in southern Oregon.

Under the plan of the association and its agreement with authorized towing and service stations, free mechanical first aid and towing service is extended members of the association anywhere within a radius of 10 miles of the station, impassable streets or roads excepted. At any time, day or night, holidays or Sundays, included, a completely equipped towing car with competent mechanics in charge will be at the disposal of association members who may meet with grief while in that district, and the disabled car will either be started or towed to the service station without charge to the member.

Should a member's car become disabled or wrecked outside the

limits of a designated zone, a distance not to exceed 25 miles from the location of the service station, the member will pay for the service at the rate of \$1.50 per hour, time to be computed from the time service car leaves the station and returns to the same point. In such instances, members will be credited with 30 minutes roadside repairs, however, and for the time consumed by tow car in making the run within zone limits, both going and returning.

If the car is so badly damaged it cannot be safely operated under its own power to a place of shelter or cannot be towed on its own four wheels, or on two of its wheels, by using a crane or dolly, and must be transported on a truck, such service will be charged for at regular rates, where the member carries insurance covering the damage to his car, he must pay the service station at regular rates and then collect from the insurance company.

If a member's car stops and cannot be started because of some mechanical trouble, when on the street or highway, a service car will be promptly dispatched to the place directed and any minor troubles, which make it impossible for the automobile to be operated, will be adjusted. If such adjustments cannot be completed within 30 minutes however, then disabled car will be towed to service station.

Included in this emergency first aid road service are such minor repairs as correction of ignition trouble, carburetor adjustment, cleaning clogged gas line, tightening loose battery connections, or any minor repairs which can be completed within a period of 30 minutes. Included

Washington and Pittsburgh Continue Out in Pennant Races

NEW YORK, Sept. 19.—(AP)—Most major league clubs were closely bunched today with the Pirates and Senators continuing their triumphant march toward the buntings.

Four Boston pitchers fell under a barrage of 18 hits from the bucaneros, who registered a 9 to 7 victory. However, Pittsburgh's lead remained at seven games as the Giants topped the Cubs 8 to 3.

The Cardinals strengthened their grip on the fourth round by turning out a 9 to 5 victory over Brooklyn. Dazy Vance, Robins' star twirler, was replaced by Brown in the eighth inning when St. Louis scored seven runs. Vance's ineffectiveness was caused by a sore finger. The Cardinals are one game in front of Brooklyn.

Philadelphia trounced the Reds, five to one, Willoughby beating Donohue in a pitching duel.

The world champions easily disposed of the White Sox, 10 to 5, but a double victory for the Athletics over the Tigers, 4 to 2 and 7 to 3, enabled the Mackmen to gain half a game. The Senators now lead by seven games. Detroit holds fourth place against Chicago by one game.

Cleveland made sixth place more secure against the Yankees by coming out on the long end of a six to five score in Boston. The Indians have a two game margin on the Hugmen.

Bob Meusel's 29th homer of the year and Babe Ruth's 20th four-bagger helped New York defeat the Browns 4 to 1. McManus of St. Louis broke the Yankees' pitchers' record of 42 earned runless innings by slamming his 13th circuit drive of the year in the sixth.

Moonshine Blamed For Wild Antics

EUGENE, Ore., Sept. 19.—Moonshine liquor is blamed by police for the escapade of a man said to be James White here last night, involving the throwing of flower pots, the breaking of a window, and frightening of residents of a district of the city. Then he went to a hotel and continued his threats. The Clarence Whitten home on Mill street was the third place visited. There the man smashed a flower pot and threatened to shoot the householder.

The man was finally captured on Kincaid street after he had crashed a second flower pot through a fraternity house window, striking one of the fraternity members.

ITALIAN PRUNE UNUSUALLY BIG

ROSEBURG, Ore., Sept. 18.—The Italian prune crop being harvested in Douglas county this year is unusual in many respects. In the first place small sizes are not to be found. Packers and others interested in the harvesting of the crop state that by far the bulk of the prunes will run 40 or better. Orchard runs are found to be almost straight 30-40's a condition which is quite unusual. Although Petites are smaller in size, yet they too are running high and are excellent in quality.

Another noticeable fact concerning the Italians is that they are lacking in "bite" and have an unusually high sugar content. Usually the Italian prune is somewhat tart and has a peculiar biting flavor. This year they are almost as sweet as the French Prune.

The prune harvest is rapidly nearing a close, and drying is expected to continue for only about a week more.
