Senators Win Pennant Again

NEW YORK, Sept. 25.—(P)—The American pennant flew unchallenged at the Washington mast head today for the second consecutive season.

Clark Griffith's Senators made certain of meeting the Pirates in the world series by sweeping both ends of a double header against Cleveland yesterday 4 to 2, and 6 to 2, while the Athletics were succumbing to the Browns in an 11 inning contest, 6 to 4.

Nine games ahead, Washington can lose all its remaining games and still take the flag.

Limiting the Tigers to four hits, Ruffing pitched shut-out ball for the Red Sox yesterday 5 to 0, reducing the chances of the Cobblers finishing better than fourth. The Tigers' defeat coupled with the St. Louis victory over the Mackmen put Detroit two and one-half games behind the third place Browns.

Babe Ruth beat the White Sox by a homer in the tenth with the bases filled, making the score 6 to 5.

Babe's twenty-first homer of the season marked the sixth time in his career that he had delivered a four ply smash with the sacks filled.

Pittsburgh, with the national pennant already won, could afford to suffer a shut-out, four to nothing, at the hands of the Giants, but New York had the satisfaction of clinching second place.

Bob McGraw, Brooklyn recruit from St. Paul, allowed only eight hits. Eppa Rixey won his own game with a single which drove home the deciding tally.

Diamond Lake Lots Now Open to Lease

Along the wooded and beautiful shores of Diamond lake, new summer home sites are now open to application according to recent announcement of Forest Supervisor Carl B. Neal of Roseburg, Ore.

The lots which are 140x180 feet in size may be leased from the forest service for \$10 a year, under a provision that the permit may be revoked at any time by the forest service. A special 10-year permit may be procured by which the lessee is obliged to pay \$15 a year.

Those to whom applications are granted must construct a cabin on the land, the type of which will be passed on by the forest service.

COOLIDGE ASKED TO THROW FIRST BALL AT OPENER

Senators Will Play First Home Game of World Series on Oct. 9th

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25.—(P)—Although they have clinched the American league pennant, the Senators will place their full strength in the field today against St. Louis here and the regulars will continue in the lineup during the three game series.

With the Browns, Detroit and Chicago fighting for the third and fourth place, Manager Harris said he would use the same strength against St. Louis that he did against the two other clubs. When the Senators go to Boston next week, most of the regulars will be left behind to put themselves in shape for the world's series.

President Griffith said the Senators would arrive in Pittsburgh on October 5. This will give them the next day to workout on Forbes field, preparatory to the opening clash of the world's series, October 7.

President Coolidge, who threw out the first ball in the opening of the world series here last year, was invited today by Clark Griffith, president of the Washington club, to act in a similar capacity October 9, the first day the Pirates appear here. He took the invitation under consideration. The president will return to the city from his trip to Omaha on October 8, thus permitting him to attend the opening game if he desires.

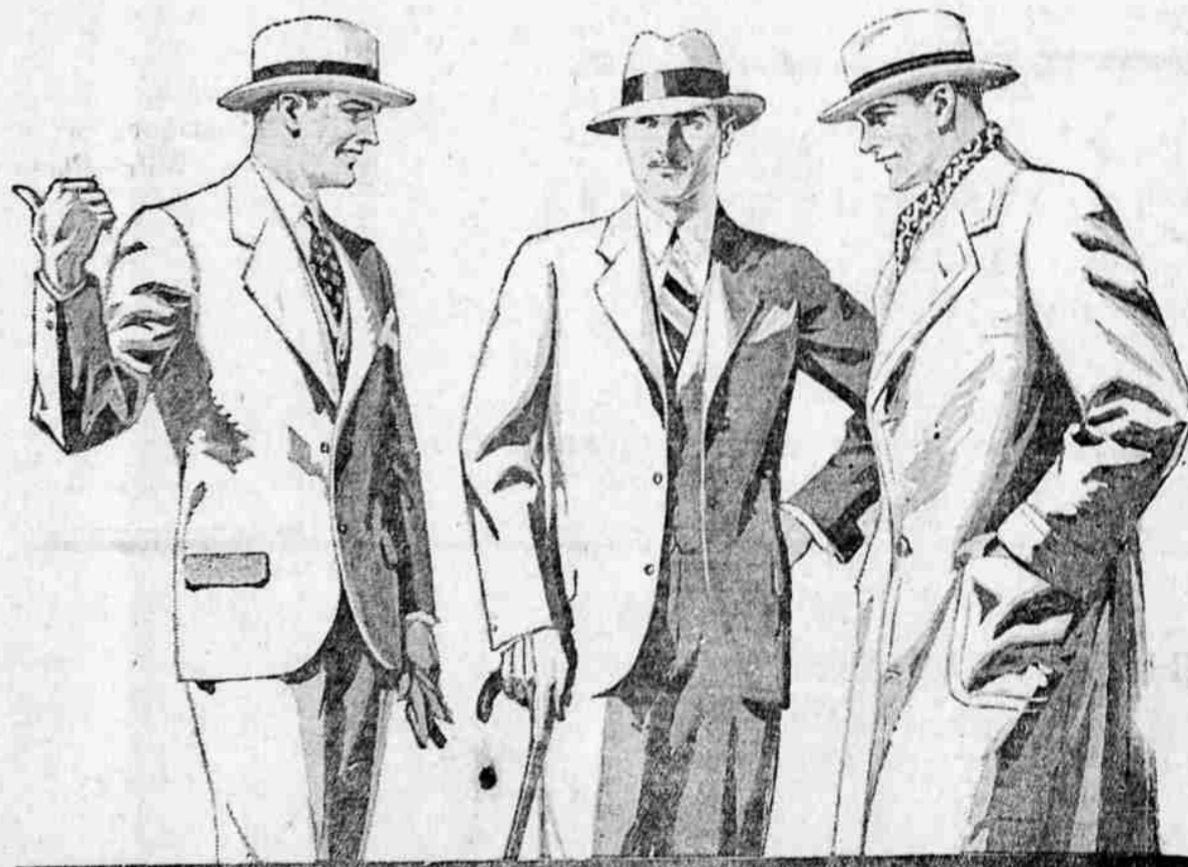
