Mr. Dean was connected with the meat packing business in Wilmington and found it necessary to dispose of his interest in that city before buying into the local concern. S. W. Nelson, who has been the manager of the retail store of the packing concern will be relieved by Mr. Dean in this capacity and will continue as manager of the packing house and the buying end of the

business. Mr. Dean was attracted to the Klamath territory because of the rapid growth of the town and the large volume of business transacted here. He is a man of wide experience in the meat packing and retail meat business and will install into the local concern many new policies concerning retail sales.
