**BALDWIN'S PIPE OF PEACE**  
AIDS IN COAL NEGOTIATIONS  
LONDON.—The pipe of peace was once more in evidence at a critical period of the recent negotiations between coal miners, owners and the government. When the two sides reached a point where a deadlock seemed inevitable, and the atmosphere was strained and formal, Premier Stanley Baldwin fumbled in his pocket and produced his pipe. This he began slowly to fill, remarking: "Let's smoke, shall we?" The suggestion was adopted by both miners and owners, and the formality of the strained atmosphere gradually disappeared. Within an hour the basis of a provisional agreement had been reached.

**JAPANESE POLICE ISSUE**  
EDICT AGAINST SHORT  
AND FILMY SKIRTS  
TOKYO.—(P)—Thin skirts and short ones may be all right for Western women, but the Metropolitan Police Board has issued an order prohibiting the Japanese fair sex from wearing abbreviated or filmy garments in public. The police order, which is being attacked editorially by some of the vernacular newspapers, warns all Japanese women—and especially geisha girls—that they will not be permitted to appear publicly unless fully clothed "in garments of the most modest style" which "do not expose the limbs unnecessarily" and which are of "sufficient thickness." The police order, however, does not affect the styles adopted by foreign women in Japan.

**GERMAN SUBMITS LOW BID**  
**FOR SWEDISH TRUCK ORDER**

**STOCKHOLM.**—(P)—A German manufacturer underbid all competitors recently for an order of a large number of heavy railroad trucks for the Swedish Railroad Board. The German, whose figure was 20 per cent under the lowest Swedish bid, was awarded two-thirds of the contract, the remainder being placed in Sweden. Proposals were asked from German, English and American manufacturers. The entire deal involved 3,000,000 crowns. The trucks are to be used in the transport of iron ore. It is pointed out here that the German manufacturer, despite the fact he will be obliged to pay a ten per cent duty, was able to underbid the Swedish company because of the low pay of German skilled labor compared with that paid in Sweden.
