

## LAYMEN FAVOR CHURCH UNITY

EUGENE, Ore., Oct. 2.—The proposals of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Methodist church, South, for admitting laymen in annual conferences on equal basis with nassed by the laymen of the 73rd annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal church of Oregon, in session this morning.

The proposals were presented to the lay body by Rev. R. N. Avison, of Salem, and following his explanation, they were passed without discussion or a negative vote. Rev. Avison represented the ministers and following the vote, congratulated the laymen on their decision.

Favorable action on both measures was taken by the ministers in regular session yesterday.

The only other business transacted by the laymen was the election of E. L. Wells of Portland, chairman, and A. J. Geddes of Roseburg, secretary.

At the regular conference session this morning the report on religious educational work in the state was given by Superintendent Jasper. A series of 13 schools had been established during the year, he reported, nine of them six day schools and four 10 day schools. Several suggestions for this work were given.

## Stewart's Daily Letter

WASHINGTON.—G. O. P. regulars are having a hard time finding a bright side to young Bob La Follette's sweeping victory at the Republican senatorial primaries in Wisconsin.

They had hardly expected him to lose but they did hope the La Follette forces in the Badger state would prove to have been weakened

by the death of the present Senate candidate's father.

Instead of that they seem to be as formidable under the junior Bob as ever they were under the senior.

What the regulars didn't take fully into account was the fact that young Bob was taking over an organization with which he was familiar. During his father's later years he had more to do with managing it than the latter did.

His Wisconsin Progressive leadership is hardly referred to correctly as "inherited."

In reality he had been coming into it gradually for some time and when the elder La Follette died, there was his son in control already.

That young Bob will be elected is accepted here, even by his bitterest opponents, as a foregone conclusion.

That, however, isn't the worst of it. The outlook is now admitted to be very dubious for Senator Leonard's re-nomination next year.

Leonard made his last successful campaign after the war, when the late Senator La Follette's influence was at low water mark.

In 1926 he'll face an altogether different situation.

The Washington administration will do all it can to help him, but if it accomplishes no more in his behalf than it was able to do to beat young Bob, this won't be sufficient.

It isn't to be disputed that Bob over his nomination and will owe his expected election, at so young an age to so high an office, to the fact that he's his father's son.

Still, this will not be altogether a handicap to him in the Senate.

It may mean some slurs, but it will mean a great deal in the way of prestige also.

If the young senator makes good on his individual merits the slurs will soon cease and the prestige of his father's name will remain, clear velvet, to add to the credit of his own accomplishments.
