WINNING TEAMS ALL READY FOR WORLD'S SERIES

First Game of Baseball Classic to be Staged at Pittsburgh Wednesday

JOHNSON WILL PITCH

Baseball Idol Will Twirl First Game for Senators—Teams Even

PITTSBURGH, Oct. 5.—(A.P.)—With the ringing down of the curtain on the major league baseball season the stage was being set today for the opening game of the world series at the Forbes field, the home lot of the National league champions, the Pittsburgh Pirates, who on Wednesday will enter the initial battle of the annual fall baseball classic as the opponents of the Washington Senators, 1925 champions of the American league and defenders of the world championship title.

Manager McKechnie and his speedy young Pirate team are home from Cincinnati where the last game on the regular schedule was played over the week end. Final practice sessions preparatory for the first clash with the veteran Senators are on the schedule for this afternoon and tomorrow morning.

"On to Pittsburgh" "Bucky" Harris was down to lead his club into Pittsburgh tonight and Forbes field will be turned over to the American leaguers tomorrow afternoon for a workout.

The double header with the Reds on Sunday afforded Manager McKechnie an opportunity to put several of his second string men into action. Pitcher Culotton, Catcher Spencer, Infielder Thompson and Outfielder Haas working in portion of the second game. Since clinching the senior circuit pennant about 19 days ago, all of Bill's strategy has been pointed toward priming the entire team, both regulars and reserves, for the title fray and no stone in that direction has been left unturned.

Meadows May Hurl No definite announcement on the pitching assignment for Pittsburgh in the first game has been made by Manager McKechnie. In the opinion of fans and sport writers, however, Lee Meadows, bespeckled mound artist who came to the buccaneers from the Phillies in 1923, will be the selection to oppose Walter Johnson, veteran standby of the youthful Bucky Harris, and the pitching hero of last year's series.

It is considered likely that Vic Aldridge, who was obtained from the Chicago Cubs last winter by trade and a holdout during the spring training season, will be the Pirate choice for the second game. With Ray Kremer slated for duty on the third day of the big tussle.

Fans Enroute Fans from the four corners of the country are assembling in the smoky city and eagerly await the call "play ball." All reserved seats were sold long ago, but carpenters are pushing to completion temporary stands in left field that will accommodate an additional 6000 enthusiasts, making the total capacity of Forbes field in excess of 45,000.

Proprietor Of Restaurant At Medford Fades

Dan Collier Disappeared After Divorce Suit

MEDFORD, Ore., Oct. 6.—Dan Collier, proprietor of a well known Medford restaurant reported doing a prosperous business, following the divorce suit started by his wife last week ago last Saturday, abandoning his business, after first informing his mother that the divorce suit had complete upset him and that he was going away.

It developed today that he left a number of unpaid bills, and about \$150 worth of checks with which he had paid off restaurant employes for their weekly salaries before leaving, and which were not honored by the bank because of no funds.

Collier's whereabouts are unknown and last night C. L. Collier, father of the missing man, who had nominally conducted the restaurant since the disappearance, and who held a first mortgage of \$1,950 on the restaurant, closed the latter on a court order.

Seventy Cars Of Cattle Go To California

Self Defense to Be Slayer's Plea

MEDFORD, Ore., Oct. 6.—Hyman Huntley, middle aged section hand, indicted last week by the grand jury on a charge of first degree murder, as an outgrowth of a stabbing affray in this city September 26, wherein Jesse Gibbs, mill worker, died, was arraigned before Circuit Judge Chas. M. Thomas Monday and entered a plea of not guilty. The attention Gibbs is alleged to have paid the wife of the gray haired prisoner, was said by the officers to have been the motive for the tragedy. It is expected that Huntley will plead self defense.
