GRIFFITH STADIUM, Washington D. C.—(AP)—Ossie Bluege, third baseman of the Washington Senators, had a slight relapse and will not play today, it was announced by Manager Harris as his men took the field with the Pirates for the third game of the world's series in a wintry setting.
Bluege was taken to a hospital, Harris disclosed, after an attempt to exercise had brought on some ill effects of the blow he sustained Thursday in the second game when hit by one of Vic Aldridge's fast curves.
Harris asserted that he did not believe there was any cause for alarm, in Bluege's condition, however, since an x-ray disclosed no broken bones or other injury. It is simply that he needs additional rest, the manager declared, adding that Bluege may be able to return to the game tomorrow.
