"A million fans give a million dollars for a baseball team for Walter," is the slogan of Williford's campaign. In less than an hour last night, fifty five local men and women gave \$1 each to the fund.

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 15.—W. W. Hoover, of Fossil was today appointed by Governor Pierce as county judge of Wheeler county to succeed the late Judge G. O. Butler, who died yesterday at The Dalles. Hoover was formerly Wheeler county judge.

If any of the Klamath boxing fans think for a minute that they won't see the "fightingest" card ever staged here when the gong sounds at Scandinavian hall next Tuesday night, let them wander over to the boys' training quarters each afternoon at 2:30 or evening at 7:30 and see the boxers work out in preparation for the bout.
Mike De Pinto, who meets Kid Starkey in the main event, wired Matchmaker Johnnie Sylvester last night that he would leave Portland today and would be ready to work out tomorrow afternoon. The Portland flash wanted to work out in Portland where he is in wonderful condition.

Earl Stolz of Bend, staged his first workout yesterday afternoon and showed the railbirds plenty. But Chuck Sams strutted his stuff last night and showed such remarkable improvement since his last bout that this battle has the fans guessing. Those who have seen both boys in action predict that the bout won't last the six rounds, and the fans are evenly divided as to which one of them will win the K. O.

Another bout that promises to bring the fans to their feet is the tangle between Wilbur Harrington and Kid Alcorn. Harrington has been doing some real training and this shaving last night in a workout with Kid Starkey was a revelation. Alcorn is a good tough boy with a powerful kick and the ability to take 'em. This will be a regular he-battle from gong to gong and probably will not last the four rounds.

Matchmaker Sylvester is taking personal charge of the training of all the boys. He makes them wade right in and fight during their workouts so he can be assured that they will be ready to stand the guff when they crawl through the ropes Tuesday night.
"Why, I saw more real action here tonight than I've seen in most of the regular cards they've staged here before," remarked one boxing bug following the workouts last night.
