## A. J. JAENICKE HERE TO MAKE WIDE SURVEY

U. S. Forest Service Man to Leave in Morning for Silver Lake

To find out whether or not pine beetle infestations outside the 1,200,000 acre area included in the southern Oregon and northern California pine beetle control project, are on the increase, A. J. Jaenicke, of Portland, forest insect expert of the U. S. forest service, will leave tomorrow for Silver Lake with an assistant.

Mr. Jaenicke's survey is a preliminary investigation of the pine beetle situation. He will ascertain in a general way whether or not the ravages of the pine beetle are still as serious as two years ago.

Mr. Jaenicke is an annual visitor to this territory.

## Stone's Buy Market Owned by F. Terry

## Air Policy Is Declared Weak

Admiral Sims, Retired, Criticizes Navy Bureau

WASHINGTON, Oct. 14.—(AP)—Rear Admiral William S. Sims, retired, U. S. Navy, told the president's air board today that "it is well known" that the navy has no "definite air policy," and that naval air development is hampered by a kind of conservatism so extraordinary it is almost unbelievable.

Present dissatisfaction and unrest in the navy, he said, is due to "a lack of confidence" in naval leaders and he pointed to the Shenandoah disaster as a case.

"It may be presumed," he added, "that the commander of the Shenandoah and his assistants were the best men the navy had, but if they were not it would have been a criminal act to get them there."

FULLER TALKS. J. H. Fuller, secretary of the Ashland chamber of commerce, brought home to the Klamath chamber yesterday, the importance of securing a government appropriation for the completion of the Crescent City harbor, in northern California. At a recent meeting held in Crescent City, at which four senatorial members of the rivers and harbors committee were present, Mr. Fuller appeared before the committee and on behalf of southern Oregon, urged that the half finished project be completed.
