Future Queen



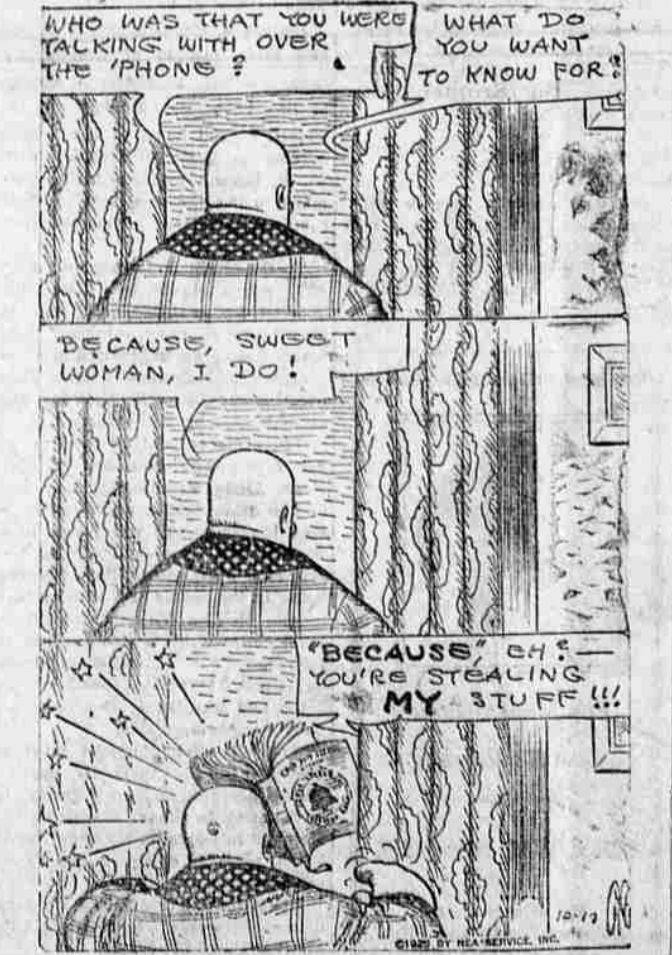
