Boxers All Ready For Tap Of Gong; Some Real Battles Are Promised Local Fans Tonight

Kid Starkey and Mike De Pinto Will Stage Great Fight—Chuck Sams and Earl Stolz Will Furnish Thrills—Other Real Bouts

Mike De Pinto vs. Kid Starkey 10 rounds Earl Stolz vs. Chuck Sams, 10 rounds Wilbur Harrington vs. Kid Alcorn, 4 rounds Jack Crim vs. Kid Sullivan, 4 rounds.

Klamath boxing fans will come into their own at Scandinavian hall at 8:30 tonight when the first card under the direction of the new matchmaker, Johnnie Sylvester, will be staged by the Klamath Falls Boxing Commission.

The boys are all primed and ready for action, and are in better physical condition than for any other boxing card staged in this city.

Can the hard-hitting and fast-moving Kid Starkey score a win over the clever Mike De Pinto, Italian lightweight of Portland? This is a question the fans have been asking and one which will be answered tonight when these two clever boys hop through the ropes to cross leather in the 10-round main event. If Starkey wins over De Pinto, Matchmaker Sylvester has promised to bring one of the top-notch Pacific coast lightweights here for him. This will be a real battle from gong to gong, and will furnish more thrills than two or three ordinary battles.

A delegation from Bend will be here to watch their favorite Earl Stolz, swap punches with Chuck Sams of Klamath Falls. These two welters will go six rounds or less, and from the way they have been showing up in the gym, either one of them is apt to kiss the canvas before their 18 minutes of punching are over.

Wilbur Harrington and Kid Alcorn are down for a 4-round special event. Harrington has been showing a world of improvement, while Alcorn, local mechanic, is no dub by a long shot. The boy can sock and can take plenty and still bore in for more. This ought to be four rounds of whirlwind action with a few knockdowns thrown in for good measure.

Jack Crim and Kid Sullivan have been substituted for the curtain raiser. Crim has always before boxed higher up on the card, but when one of the preliminary boys ran out on Sylvester, Crim agreed to go on. He will be placed up higher on the next card if he shows up well tonight.

The ring has been cut down to regulation size and the seating arrangements have been improved at the hall, so the fans can have a

better view of the ring that heretofore.

All in all, it looks like a whale of a card with real action crammed into each and every bout. The curtain raiser will start promptly at 8:30, and all other bouts will be ready to go on without any delays. If the fans show a willingness to support boxing, Matchmaker Sylvester gives assurance that Klamath Falls this winter will see boxing cards that would pack 'em in any place on the coast.

President Coolidge's hint that the United States would be willing to do something more toward limitation of armaments is regarded in some quarters as among the most important results of the Locarno negotiations. The Westminster Gazette urged the European governments to give serious attention to the president's hint.

Stewart's Daily Letter

STEWART NEA Service Writer WASHINGTON.—Diplomacy in Washington is greatly shocked at the Chinese ministry of justice's charge that the foreigners' consular courts in China show favoritism toward their own nationals when called on to try them for offenses against natives. All the same, everybody who ever

had any experience in the far east knows that these courts' decisions almost always are on the side of the foreigners and against the natives.

It's hardly to be expected of human nature that the situation should be otherwise.

An American, for instance, is arraigned in the American consular court say at Shanghai, on charges which Chinese accusers, or perhaps European residents of the foreign settlement, are pressing against

him. The judge may well feel some little prejudice in favor of his own countryman without being the least bit crooked, and still more so the jury. The extra-territorial system in its nature, obviously lends itself to injustice.
