MOFFETT FIGHTS MITCHELL PLAN

DES MOINES, Iowa, Oct. 27.—In a fighting navy day speech, Rear Admiral Moffett, chief of the navy bureau of aeronautics, declared here today in his opposition to a separate air force, as proposed by Colonel William Mitchell, in his support of the plan for an air service as part of the fleet.
"President Coolidge stated the navy's case," the admiral asserted, "when he said that what we need is a 'balanced fleet.' By this he meant a balanced fleet on the surface, under the surface and over the surface.
"The navy in four brief years is all that has been said, has not been surpassed anywhere in its aviation. This is a record of achievement in which the country can well feel proud."
Speaking of the efforts necessary to build up naval aviation, and without mentioning Colonel Mitchell by name, Admiral Moffett said: "We have not complained because we have to fight, in fact, we have rather enjoyed it. We have carried on our fight according to the rules of the game. We think it honorable, sportsmanlike and loyal to play the game according to the rules, than to win it over the heads of the civil administration in an appeal to the people."
Opposition to a separate "air force," contemplating employment of aviation as a separate and independent force and entity as distinguished from an "air service" employing aviation as a component part of either the army or navy, was based partly on the ground, Admiral Moffett said, that it "contemplated revolutionary changes in the system of administration."
