Bancroft Law, while some of the expense will have to be borne by the city. It will also be necessary to raise money through the issuance of bonds for flush coating these paved streets which are rapidly deteriorating through long usage.

Third, Sewer Disposal Plant - The Council has under consideration a complete Sanitary survey of the city and the installation of a modern sewer disposal plant and system. The health of the entire city is jeopardized by every day's delay in this project, and when the plan is perfected and submitted to the voters it should meet with their hearty support and endorsement.

Fourth, Street Lights - No other city of importance on the Pacific Coast is handicapped with such an antiquated system of street lighting as that serving the business section of Klamath Falls. The project should be given serious attention and some plan decided upon without further delay.

Fifth, Modern Form of City Government - We should awaken to the fact that Klamath Falls is destined to be a city of importance. The time is here when we should plan and build for the future. Klamath Falls is a Five Million Dollar corporation, yet, under our present system, the entire management of its vast and extremely intricate business has to be handled as a side issue to the private interests of its officials. This is due entirely to the system under which we are operating and full credit should be given those who are so unselfishly sacrificing their time and energies for the public welfare, but if we are to build a city here, such as we all desire, we should plan scientifically and systematically so that our expenditures today will not be wasted tomorrow, but may be used for the completion of a part of a permanent plan. We urgently recommend the careful study and consideration of the City Manager Form of Government which is proving so successful in many of the progressive cities throughout the country. This matter would require months of careful investigation and could be best handled through an officially appointed Charter Commission, as it would necessitate the drafting of a new charter for submission to the voters.

building or buildings be provided for the care of contagious cases. Provided no other more suitable location is available, we would suggest that the old pest house be destroyed or removed, the ground leveled and planted to grass, and one or two small cottages be built. An additional cottage could be added each year until the needs of the city are served. With strict economy and the judicious use of the money it might be possible to handle this expense from the General Fund during the coming year, otherwise a special levy would be necessary.
Second, Sixth Street, Oregon Avenue and Street Flushing - Due to the increasing and heavy traffic on these two main entrances to the city, some plan must be worked out for the permanent repaving of these streets which will include an underground passage under the main line of the Southern Pacific on Sixth street. Some of these improvements, undoubtedly can be made under the
