Widely Known Geologist Is Forum Speaker

J. E. Loreman Tells of Research Work in County

An explanation of the subject of geology, a summing up of the various methods used by geologists in determining conditions in any certain area as they existed in prehistoric times and finally a talk on the geological conditions of Klamath county with reference to possible oil-bearing formations was given today at the Forum luncheon by J. E. Loreman, geologist of national reputation...

Mr. Loreman remarked on the fact that no work of any sort had been done in the Klamath region by the government with a view to ascertaining the possibility of oil production.

Outlining the procedure employed by a geologist in the search for oil Mr. Loreman gave the following steps:

- 1-Finding whether the area in question has formations such as produce oil in proven fields. 2-Finding if these formations are of such a nature as to accumulate and retain oil...

Mr. Loreman stated that as a result of his research work here within the past 3 weeks he had found one section in which there appeared to be structural conditions favorable for oil production.

In Montana, Mr. Loreman was instrumental in securing funds which assured completion of the discovery well of the Kevin-Sunburst field...
