**CLAIM KLAMATH  
DUCKS ARE GOOD**  
(Continued From Page One)

counties, is the only section affected  
by some serious disease. The section  
affected comprises a part of the Tule  
lake bed, consisting of eight or ten  
square miles. In this district various  
estimates have been made of the  
number of dead ducks, ranging from  
10,000 to 50,000 but regardless of  
what the actual number of dead  
might be, the disease there is very  
serious. It has been pronounced a  
form of near-cholera although definite  
and authentic reports have not yet  
been received. It is rather pecu-  
liar to note that out of 79 ducks  
picked up in that section and placed  
in fresh water at Klamath Falls,  
only 20, or 25% have died to date,  
and these all within three days of the  
time they were brought in. The bal-  
ance comprising 75, or 80%, practi-  
cally recovering after two or three  
days in the fresh water, were again  
able to fly.

**Doubt Malignant Disease**  
"While the disease may or may  
not be cholera, it is believed that  
this percentage would not recover  
if it was a very malignant form of  
this fowl disease.

"Since the season opened in  
Klamath county, hunting has been of  
daily occurrence, thousands of birds  
being killed and eaten without a  
single case of sickness resulting. Al-  
so no evidence of cholera has been  
noticed in the poultry throughout  
the Klamath project. While every  
effort should be made to diagnose  
and control the disease on Tule lake,  
that section should not be confused  
with Klamath county, with its thou-  
sands of acres of lakes, rivers and  
grain fields, and the hundreds of  
thousands of ducks contained there-  
in. In reports given out by Mr. Ton-  
kin, federal game warden from Cal-  
ifornia, it was inferred that the en-  
tire Klamath county has been includ-  
ed in the affected areas, which is  
more or less of a mis-statement of  
the actual conditions."
