

PUREBRED HERD OF SHORTHORNS IS MOVED HERE

Prominent Breeder of Cattle Chooses Klamath County to Raise Livestock

Further addition to the quality of Klamath County livestock was made last week with the arrival of J. B. Cornett and his herd of purebred Shorthorns, numbering 58 head. The firm of J. B. Cornett & Son of Shed, Oregon, is one of the best known on the Pacific coast, by all breeders of purebred Shorthorns. This herd was established about 25 years ago and has included some of the best bulls in the United States. Some of the outstanding bulls used in this herd are Minority's Welcome, Clifton King, Lebanon, Chief, Rasper Sultan, Divide Ensign and Hercules Master, the present senior herd sire. Rasper Sultan was perhaps the outstanding bull, being a son of Rasper Champion, grand champion Shorthorn bull of Scotland.

Mr. Cornett has long realized that the location in the Willamette Valley was not the best, and after a careful examination decided that conditions in Klamath county were ideal for the beef industry. Part of the herd is on the F. T. Nelson & Son ranch near Worden, and the balance on the Skillet Handle. In years past several animals from this herd have made their way into Klamath county to head some of the purebred Shorthorn herds here.

This herd was one of the first to show at the Pacific International Mr. Cornett being one of the few original breeders to help build the show to its present proportions. It is also one of the best advertised, having shown in all sections of the west and has been second to none in competition.

Tears and thrills are partners in the enthralling photodrama, "As No Man Has Loved," at the Pine Tree theater on Armistice day. Although Rowland V. Lee has made a pure love story of Edward Everett Hale's immortal epic, "The Man Without a Country," it is a nation's love story.

A tremendous theme is this story of young Lieutenant Nolan, who, lured by the glamour of Aaron Burr's fame and charm, forgot his allegiance to the land under whose flag he fought, and, damning the United States, said he never wanted to see it or hear of it again.

He had his wish. Guilty by court martial, he was doomed to fulfill the wish he voiced. Thereafter for fifty six years he sailed the Seven Seas on the various ships of the United States navy, treated with the kindly consideration due his rank, but doomed never to hear the name of the United States, never to see a map, never to set foot on shore, never to receive a letter or hear a man on ship talk of country, friends or home.

In ignorance of passing events he didn't know how the country grew until its flag showed thirty four stars for it had but thirteen when he knew it last. He didn't know the name of the president. He had no tidings of mother or sweetheart, though the sweetheart, loving, lonely and loyal, from the days of Jefferson to Lincoln, spent her time striving only to gain a pardon for him. Gaining it from Lincoln of the big heart, she sent it to the ship, went to the pier and answered the Last Call as her feeble eyes peered over the watery expanse from which a sail might bring her happiness.

On this amazing theme is built a picture that will live for years. But the thrilling storm scene with the gallant frigate "Essex" battling a frightful gale off Hatteras; the tremendous naval battle between a ship of the line and a pirate sloop ship, and picturesque scenes on the Mississippi are not the elements that give the play its great power; that lies far deeper—in the very depths of the human heart.
