NORTHERN LINES WILL ADVERTISE KLAMATH COUNTY

1926 Budget Calls for Inclusion of This County in Ad Program

Klamath will be advertised, extensively and completely, in an advertising program that will be initiated next year by the Northern lines, according to word received here today by officials of the Klamath Irrigation district.

Confident that they will be allowed entrance to the Klamath country, and anxious to interest middle western and eastern business men and farmers in the Klamath country, the Northern lines have included Klamath

in their 1926 advertising budget.

Not only will the tourist attractions of the county be stressed, but also the possibilities for expansion and development in industrial and agricultural pursuits.

The Winchester Bay Lumber company has concluded arrangements with Manager T. F. Maginnis of the Port of Coos Bay to ship their mill output through Coos Bay for the coming winter at least.

The lumber will be hauled here by rail from the mill and transferred over the Port dock to the steamer Winchester and other vessels.

Manager Hubbard said that bar conditions at the Umpqua precluded dependable water shipping direct from Reedsport this winter. A strong effort is being made to secure more federal aid for the developing of the Umpqua and it is hoped by another year to have the present channel difficulties remedied. — Coos Bay Times.

Sunday Mail Must Be in by 8 A. M.

Outgoing mail of Klamath, whether by stage or train, must be in the local post office not later than 8 o'clock on Sunday mornings, was the announcement made today by the postmaster, John A. McCall. With the limited amount of help allowed in the post office on Sunday this rule has to be observed. The last collections from mail boxes on Main street on Saturday will be made at 5:30 in the evening for outgoing trains and stages.

Starting today the lobby of the post office will be open night and day as the old schedule called for, fixtures having been installed within the last few days.

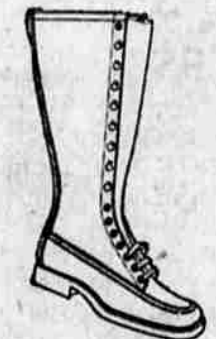
