### DOUBTS CHILD PRODIGY

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Doubts about authorship of internationally famous poems credited to 12-year-old Nathalia Crane of Brooklyn are now raised by Edwin Markham, honorary president of the Poetry Society of America, and winner of last year's \$200 poetry review prize.

This is a moment in merry America.

"The sophisticated viewpoint of sex and, on life, the special knowledge of history and archeology, places them beyond the reach of any juvenile mind."

### A. F. Graham To Manage Estate

Life-long Friend of John Campbell Named

The difficult question as to what should be done with the hardware business of the Klamath Hardware company was solved yesterday in the appointment of A. F. Graham as administrator of the estate of the late John Campbell.

Keen interest has been stirred up among the friends of the deceased, who have been solicitous as to the welfare of his children so suddenly cast upon their own resources. During his lifetime Mr. Campbell, who was sole owner of the Klamath Hardware company, had his 13 year old son with him in the store. The young man had shown remarkable ability, but it was recognized that he needed the guiding hand of an experienced mind and with that end in view, nearly a score of Mr. Campbell's friends met, at the request of the heirs, with the object in view of selecting someone as administrator of the estate whom they believed would carry on the plans of the deceased so that his children would benefit to the fullest extent.

At this conference it was unanimously decided to request A. F. Graham to act as administrator and later as guardian for the minor children. Mr. Graham consented, with the provision that his services be received without any financial return to him, to which request the heirs and friends consented.

When the matter was presented to County Judge Bunnell he promptly signed the order appointing Mr. Graham.
