

TORNADO CAUSES SLIGHT DAMAGE

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 16.—(AP)—No great damage resulted from the tornado which swept a section of the Willamette valley in the Independence district last Wednesday, declared Edward L. Wells, government forecaster who returned today from a tour of inspection of the storm area.

"I found some evidence of a tornado, but it was not a strong one," he said. "I found no well defined path where damage was done, but I found evidence of a whirl of the wind and of an explosive force."

"No large amount of damage was done. The buildings wrecked or damaged were old sheds and hop driers for the most part, and some old trees in orchards were blown down near Independence. An old prune drier at Liberty was wrecked."

"The damage from the tornado was traced over a tract of four or five miles. At no point was the path clearly defined. Apparently the twister would strike the earth and withdraw in a very short distance it would rise. For instance, at the Walker hop ranch, two old sheds used for pickers were wrecked, the twister rose, passing over two other buildings and then descended, damaging a hop drier just a short distance away."

SEXTON COUPLE DENIED DIVORCE

Judge Decides Charges by Each Not Supported by Evidence Produced

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Sexton are still man and wife, despite the efforts of each to sever the marriage ties. By a decision handed down from the bench Saturday afternoon by Judge A. L. Leavitt, the request for a divorce from each was denied. The court held that neither Mr. Sexton nor Mrs. Sexton introduced sufficient evidence to support their respective charges in their divorce complaints.

Mrs. Sexton had filed suit for the divorce, asking for the custody of their minor child. Mr. Sexton filed a counter suit for divorce, also demanding custody of the child.

VICTORIA, B. C., Nov. 16.—(AP)—A severe earthquake lasting two hours and thought to have centered in the vicinity of the Aleutian Islands in the northern part of the Pacific ocean was recorded on the seismograph at Gonzales Heights here today. The disturbance was estimated to be 2200 miles from here.

County Court Puts Stop To Road Blockade

A fence, partly blocking the Mendenhall road, will be removed at once if the county court's orders are obeyed. The ultimatum to have it torn down was to have been delivered today to W. Miller, by County Road Engineer Frank Z. Howard.

Mr. Miller is the owner of approximately 80 acres south of town. Realizing that the city is expanding rapidly, he decided to plat his land into lots. When the survey was made he came to the conclusion that some of the ground, over which the Mendenhall road traversed, belonged to him. So he extended his fence line unit it takes in one half the width of the road for a stretch of a quarter of a mile.

The matter came to a head Saturday. It was emphasized at the county court meeting that the road had been in common usage for 15 years, and that if Miller had a valid claim which was extremely doubtful, he forfeited that claim by not claiming his right prior to this time.

Limit on Fees Is Approved by Court

EL PASO, Tex., Nov. 7.—She's only 18 years old—She has been married four times and divorced three times—

She's now starting in on her fourth husband, and she vows that before they lay her among the daisies, she'll set a world's record as a matrimonial quick-change artist.

She started in life as Pauline Nixon, out in the great open spaces of Texas where men are plentiful as well as chivalrous.

Pauline hardly got a square deal in life, at that. When she was 14 she had gotten enough cards from the bottom of the deck to make many an older person throw the whole hand into the discard and call for a new deal.

To begin with, her father and mother were at odds. Each one wanted the sole custody of Pauline. Once the father kidnapped her and immured her in a convent for three years. Then, motoring in the desert, he ran afoul of bandits and was shot to death. This ended the family row, but not Pauline's troubles.

Craved Pleasure The girl had grown up fast, amid such fast-moving surroundings, and at the age of 13 she became filled with a craving for life—life with its pleasures and gaieties that the older people seemed able to take, but that always were denied her.
