GORDON LEASES BECKLEY RANCH FOR FIVE YEARS

\$4000 a Year Rent Will Be Paid By Prominent Rancher of Fort Klamath

For the next five years, the Christine Beckley ranch in the fertile Wood river valley country will be operated by Henry J. Gordon, prominent rancher, it became known today. Mr. Gordon has secured a lease on the property at \$4,000 a year for the next five years.

The land lies adjacent to the Gordon ranch and includes over 1000 acres of the finest grazing land in southern Oregon.

Hunters on Link River Are Warned

"To hunt along Link river, is unlawful and any hunter caught shooting birds on the river is subject to arrest," was the message of one bird.

Once a year, District Game Warden Marion J. Barnes delivers this edict, to give aspiring hunters fair warning of what will happen if they do not heed the warning.

"Not only is it unlawful to hunt on Link river, from its source to its mouth, but it is also wrong to hunt in that small part of lower Klamath lake which lies within the city limits and the upper end of Ewauna lake which is within the boundaries of Klamath Falls," Mr. Barnes said this afternoon.

CHANDLER SUES FOUCH, SIEMENS

Twenty-five hundred dollars is the sum at issue in a suit filed this afternoon in circuit court against J. W. and Lucinda Siemens and Roy Fouch, by George L. Chandler, Mr. Chandler, in his complaint, sets forth that the three defendants owe him \$2500 on a promissory note, dating back to May 1922. In addition he asks for interest and attorneys fees of \$250.

Eight Inches Falls on Ashland Highway; 18 Inches on Sand Creek Mt.
