TROOPS MUTINOUS

TSINGTAO, China, Nov. 16. (AP)—Marshal Chang Tso Liang's fifth Shantung division, becoming mutinous yesterday fired from the rear on the Russian white brigade attached to Chang's forces. It is reported that the majority of the Russians were killed.

The Russians were endeavoring to stem the advance of Marshall Wu Pei-Fu's alliance forces when fired on. The wounded lay without medical aid until foreign doctors from Tsinanfu daringly entered the fighting area and brought them out.

Most of the Feng Tien Manchurian troops in Shantung are natives of Shantung, and disinterested observers say it would not be surprising if the majority went over to Wu as the whole population is said strongly to favor the allies.

The Russian brigade fired on by the mutineers numbered 3,000 and included an armored car party, all the members of which are said to have been killed.
