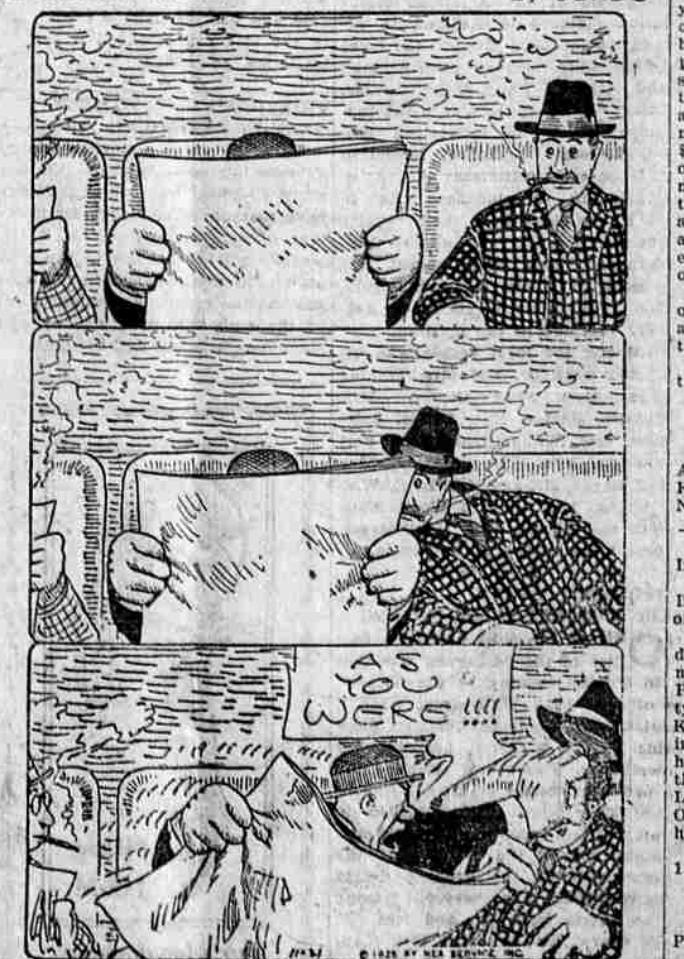
Eighth: And that the plaintiff have such further and other relief in the premises as to the Court may seem meet and equitable.
