## GEESE FALL FOR ANCIENT TRICK

### Tumble Weed Ruse Brings Limit to Three Hunters Out of One Flock

Every once in awhile an old trick or ruse, as ancient as Methuseleh, is revived and works with startling success. And that is just what happened yesterday in a stubble field on the west side of Tule lake.

Frank Taylor, of Reedport, espied a large flock of geese quietly feeding in the middle of a grain field. There was no cover whose protection would enable him to slip up on the fat game birds.

About that time, a couple of sheep herders, drifted along, and suggested resorting to the time honored trick of covering oneself with tumble weeds and walking into the flock.

So the shepherders and Taylor scooped up weeds, and holding them before them walked out into the field and right into the center of the flock. Suddenly the geese flushed and simultaneously three guns spoke. The bombardment was fast and sure and when the last goose had winged his way out of shooting distance, three hunters discovered that they had killed exactly a limit for each, eight birds apiece and 24 birds in all.

But there were few hunters who had any luck, as far as geese were concerned. The day was clear and in the late morning and early afternoon, warm. Hence the geese were flying high, out of shooting range. Most hunters, however, netted large bags of ducks.

## Grange Will Play Professional Ball

CHICAGO, Nov. 23.—(P)—Harold "Red" Grange, the reigning football hero of the moment will don his fighting togs again on Thanksgiving Day, but he will not wear the famous "77" of college days.

For Red has turned professional. Declaring that he had no training that would enable him to accept other alluring offers, the strawberry blonde warrior of the chalked field, signed a contract yesterday that will place him in the Chicago Bears' line-up for six games, after which he will invade Florida during the holidays.

Contract terms were not made public, but it was understood that Grange was guaranteed \$2,000 a game with 10 per cent on the first 5,000 dollars, 20 per cent on the second five, and 40 per cent on every dollar beyond that. On that basis, it was estimated Grange would receive between \$20,000 and \$30,000 for his first game.

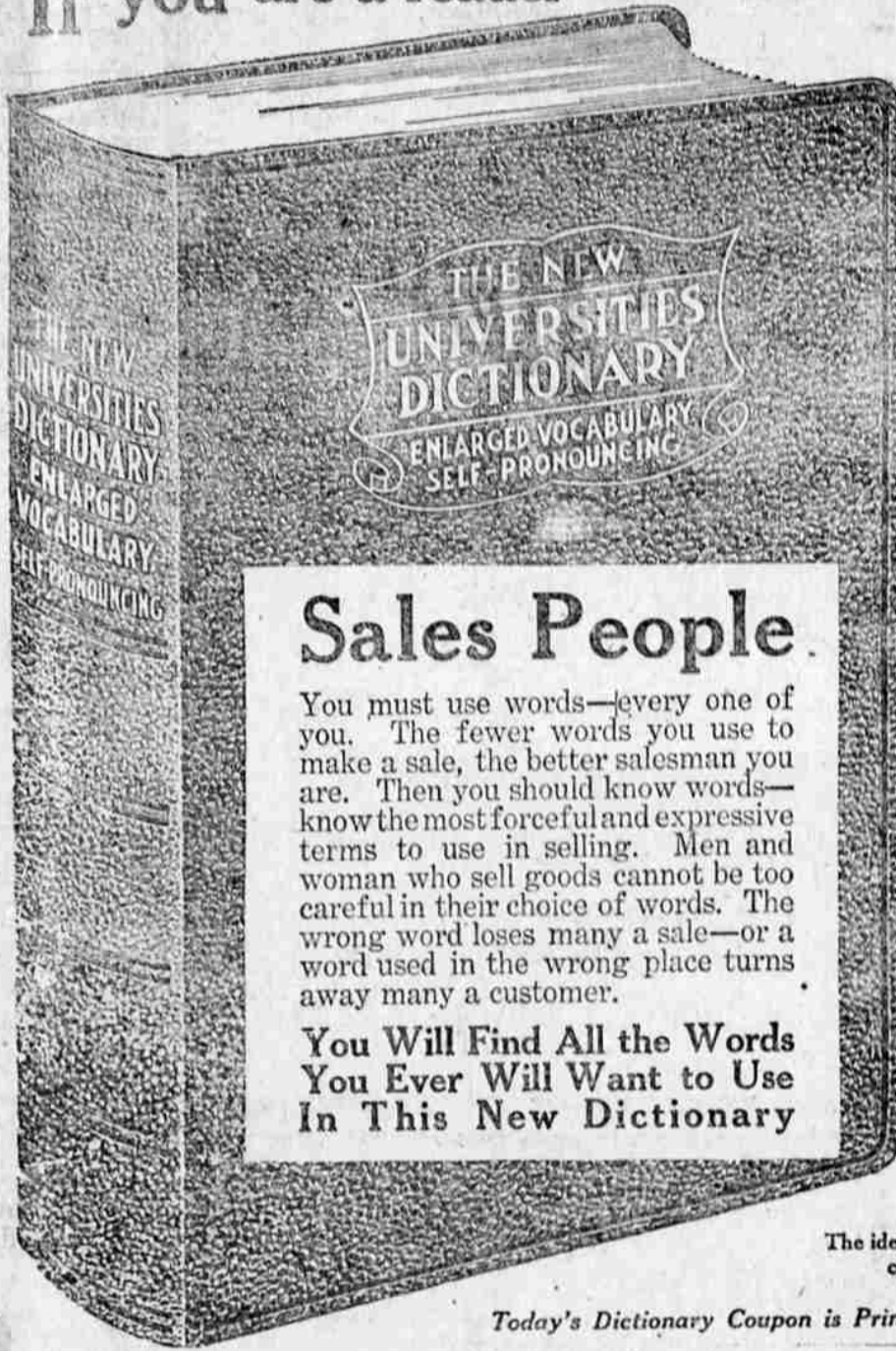

Enthusiastic endorsements from the heads of more than one thousand public schools in Pacific Coast states have been received by the Union Oil company of California as a result of its displaying 1500 full size billboards carrying the message "Children Will Play, Be Careful."
