Klamath High To Play Benson Poly of Portland

Klamath Falls people will have an opportunity Thanksgiving day of seeing a football game that ought to be a thriller from whistle to whistle when the rejuvenated Klamath high school squad will meet the fast Benson Polytechnic school team of Portland at the fair grounds field.

The game will start promptly at 1 o'clock in order that it can be over in plenty of time for the Thanksgiving dinners later in the day.

The Benson team will be put to an expense of \$430 in making the long jaunt to Klamath Falls and although they have been given no guarantee, the local school is anxious to net this amount in order that friendly relations might be established between Klamath Falls and the Portland schools.

The Benson Polytechnic team stood fourth in the Portland city league this year, there being five teams below them in percentage. This makes the team a little better than the average high school team in Portland and will give Klamath people an opportunity to get a good line on the ability of the local boys.

The Klamath team for years past has cut no figure in southern Oregon football. It generally has been in the cellar, but this year it has shown wonderful improvement and stands second only to Medford. It ought to be a fast game in every branch of football and the people of Klamath will be assured a good Thanksgiving program if they will go out and support the local boys.
