berger. When darkness fell, he did not put in an appearance at the automobile with his two other companions. Nor did any shots from the lake, then enshrouded by night, give them an inkling of where he was.

Carter, one of the men with whom he was hunting, admitted the possibility of Hardberger being hurt.

"Yes, we think that there is a chance he accidentally shot himself out there in the lake," Carter said. We could not tell whether or not he was shooting because of the din from other hunters."

"It was particularly difficult to get out of the marsh yesterday. It took me two hours to drag myself 250 yards, but I only sank up to my middle, so I doubt whether he sank over his head."

Hardberger, an experienced hunt-

er, had confined his shooting in Tule lake to the west side of Tule lake. His expedition to the east side was his first since he has hunted in Klamath county.

A searching party led by Carter left this morning for Tule lake to undertake the search for Carter.

French Crisis Yet In Doubt

PARIS, Nov. 26. (AP)—France's ministerial crisis today entered its fifth day and the solution, rendered more difficult of the decision of the socialist party caucus this morning to refrain from entering a minority headed by former Premier Herriot, appears to be no nearer than when M. Painleve resigned Sunday.

The protracted cabinet crisis has intensified the rumor of an coup d'etat which have been in circulation since the fall of M. Painleve's previous ministry in the latter part of October. The organs of the parties of the right are accusing the socialists of preparing the power by force while the left parties contend that such a danger comes from the fascist organizations.

Although everyone is discussing the possibility of a coup d'etat there is no tangible development among the right or left which will lead an observer to believe that a stroke of force is imminent. However, experts on the political affairs of France agree that the country and evolving toward a situation which would make a coup d'etat possible.

SLEEPING TESTS ARE BEING MADE

PITTSBURGH, Nov. 26.—(AP)—Pittsburgh has 12 "experimental sleepers" who nightly, while resting in the arms of Morpheus, are aiding scientists in tests which are expected to make this world a better place in which to sleep.

A technical study of the psychology of sleep is being made by scientists of the Mellon Institute of industrial research, and a dozen boys, students at the University of Pittsburgh and Carnegie Institute of Technology, are the "subjects."

Dr. H. M. Johnson, noted for his scientific work and formerly of the faculty of Ohio State university, is in charge of the work.

The 12 boys sleep in specially constructed beds, mounted on simulators, which permit of easy lateral motion in the two horizontal planes, in opposition to the tension of light springs, and to each bed is attached a recording apparatus which indicates every change of posture, both as to time and extent.

The recording apparatus attached to each of the experimental beds will chronicle the degree and time of the movements of the sleeper, which will indicate periods when there is not complete relaxation. Experiments will be made after a sufficient number of "readings" are obtained to give a working basis, using various types of beds and bedding in an effort to find the most desirable and sleep-inducing condition.

Using the standards obtained as to the rate or depth of sleep, it will be a matter of record taking, the scientists say, to determine the relationship between sleep under one condition or another, under certain types of bedding and in certain types of beds, under degrees of fatigue and other problems.
