CUSTOMS OF CIVILIZATION KILLING OFF ESKIMOS, SAYS DOCTOR
EDMONTON, Alta.—(P)—Dr. D. after one year at Aklavik, in the delta of the Mackenzie river, predicted that not many years would elapse before the Eskimo would be exterminated by disease through adopting white men's ways of living.

Eskimos and Indians of the Delta are suffering from intestinal parasitic attacks due to eating raw fish, rabbits and other meats, said the doctor, but these are not serious a problem as cancer and appendicitis, which are becoming prevalent.
