PARIS, Dec. 3. (AP) — Premier Briand new cabinet has won its first victory. After an all night and all forenoon fight in the chamber of deputies for his financial measures, the premier succeeded in forcing the adoption of new advances from the bank of France to the government of six billion francs and a new paper money issue of 7,500,000,000.

Coast Lumbermen Cut About Eight Billion Feet At Loss Of \$400,000 In Past Season

Oregon and Washington lumber producers last year cut and sold more than 8,000,000 feet of lumber and lost about \$400,000, says Basing Points, published by Baker, Fentress & Co. Chicago and Portland, adding: "During the first quarter of the current year coast sales have shown an average loss of 28 cents a thousand board feet. One reason for this, which is overlooked by most critics of the industry, is to be found in the tremendous rise in wages since 1918 when the eight hour day went into force.
