Safe Crossing For Sixth St. Will Be Built

Local Business Men Confer With S. P. Officials

Plans are being drawn and cost estimates are being calculated, preparatory to the construction of an underground railroad crossing on Sixth street where Southern Pacific railroad tracks cross.

A committee of business men, members of the Sixth Street Industrial club, waited on J. W. Fitzgerald, superintendent of the Shasta Division this morning and were informed that the railroad concern fully realized the necessity of building the safe crossing.

The cost of the underground crossing would be met jointly by the city and railroad company. The public service commission, at a public hearing here would allocate the cost of each party.

The underground crossing is one of the principal projects advocated by the Sixth Street Industrial club, an organization comprised of principal property owners on Sixth street.

SWAIN IN ITALY IS WILLING TO MARRY 'JORDAN'

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 10.—Piereddu Giuseppe, a young man of Sardinia, Italy, wants to marry "Jordan," the mystery woman who several weeks ago advertised in the Capital Journal for a husband. Her proposal was that she would pay \$400 to a suitable man whose name she could use as her legal husband for three months so that she might inherit an estate. Some 300 answers to the advertisement came from all parts of the United States. Now they have started coming from across the seas.

If the Oregon woman cannot go to Sunny Italy, then Giuseppe is willing to come to Salem—but in addition to the \$400 he wants \$1,000 to finance the round trip and the expenses of his sojourn here.

Admits Theft Of Timepiece

LOS ANGELES, Calif., Dec. 10.—(AP)—The clock that formerly ticked in the home of Pola Negri, film star, then ticked its way into a pawn shop and was the cause of the arrest of Peter Rossian, actor, on a charge of grand larceny, appeared again today in court here.

Miss Negri had valued it at \$1000; the defense differed with her estimate. Today the court upheld the defense contention that the time piece was worth about \$150, and reduced the charge to one of petty larceny. Rossian then pleaded guilty to the theft and will be sentenced Monday.

PLAN REPAIR OF STATE HIGHWAY

A section of road which bears one of the heaviest traffic loads within the county, the section of the Dalles-California highway from Altamont south to the junction of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview highway, will be repaired next week, it was announced this morning from the state highway office.

On next Monday, five state highway trucks will begin to haul gravel from Hatch Pit, a rock crusher on the Merrill road, to the scene of the improvement project. It is planned to bolster up weak places in the highway, worn down by the constant hammer of heavy traffic, and to improve the road generally.

Temporary Postal Rates Will Stand

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10.—(AP)—The senate today adopted a resolution introduced by Chairman Moses of the senate post office committee authorizing continuation of the present temporary postal rates until the opening of the next session of congress or until the committee now investigating the rates completes its report.

Repeal of Income Tax Law Is Asked



Preliminary Work on Paving Project Now Under Way

Already plans are being drawn for the paving of Main street east from Spring street to the Government canal and by the time spring arrives, all the preliminary work will be completed and the paving project will be ready to start.

Assistant City Engineer Gene Henry, as soon as he completes the plans, will submit them to the city council for approval. If property holders disprove of the plans they may remonstrate at a given time set by the council.

The next paving project for 1926 that will soon be under way is the paving of several blocks on Worden avenue.

"If citizens desiring paving of streets in their vicinity, would just submit their petitions this winter, so that all preliminary legal procedure could be disposed of during the winter months, it would facilitate the work both for the district affected and the city itself," Gene Henry said this morning.
