Be Careful Where You Cut Down Your Christmas Trees

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 16. —(P)—That the practice of taking Christmas trees along roadsides, or wherever they may be found, is not only morally wrong, but a direct violation of the law both in Oregon and Washington, is the substance of a statement issued today by the United States forest service.
 The Oregon law provides for treble damages for trespass or cutting trees, stating that "Whenever any person shall cut down, girdle or otherwise injure or carry off any tree, timber or shrub on the land of another, without lawful authority in an action by such person, if judgment be given for the plaintiff, it shall be given for treble the amount of damages."
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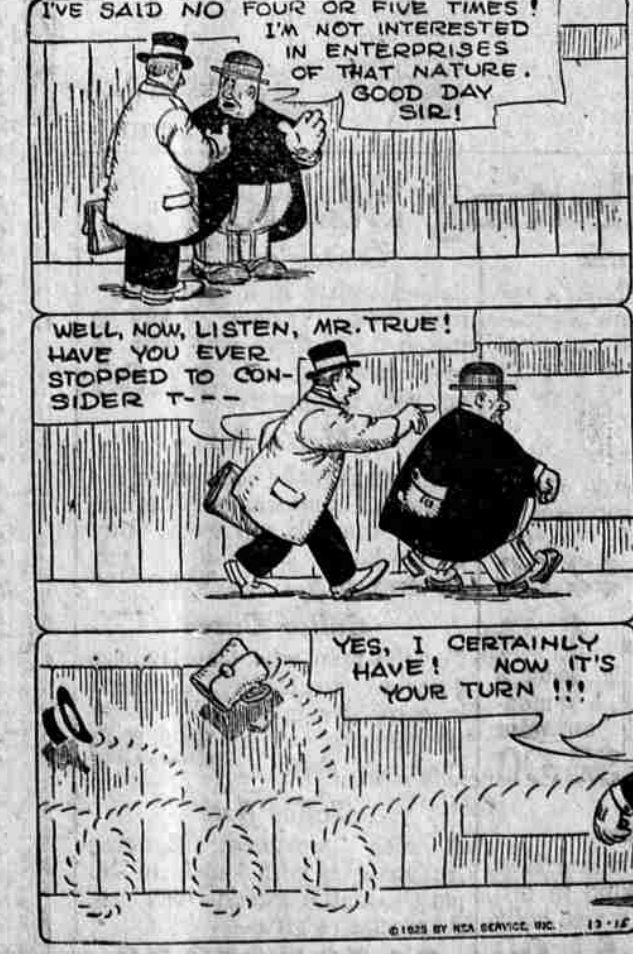
Seek Moron as Triple Slayer

BATAVIA, Ill., Dec. 16. —(P)—Police hunting for the murderer who Saturday night slew Henry Heake, 34, and his wife and their six year old son Ralph, said they were convinced the killer was Herman Coppes, 26, a moron, who as a boy of 14 slew Mrs. Manny Slep and her two babies in her farm home in Plato, Ill., 12 miles northwest of here. Coppes escaped some months ago from the prison farm at Joliet, where he was serving a life sentence.

BATTLING SIKI KILLED BY RUM SELLER, BELIEF

NEW YORK, Dec. 15. —(P)—An obscure bootlegger is being sought today as the man who shot Battling Siki, ending the garish career of the Senegalese "wild man" of the prize ring.
 Police are seeking the bootlegger as his murderer because Mrs. Louis Phal, Siki's wife, told them her husband was threatened by a man trying to collect a \$20 liquor debt a few days ago.
 Those of the ring and underworld who had followed Siki's exploits were not surprised when his body was found face down in a gutter in "Hell's kitchen" for he had been in many brawls there.
 After he met a young mulatto in Memphis and married her, he came to New York and Hell's kitchen to build up a reputation as a wild young street dandy.
 He rode all night in taxicabs, refused to pay and then challenged the drivers to fight for their fare—which they frequently did. He walked about town with a wine bearer at his heels and on three successive days invaded the Pennsylvania station too late to catch a train for Memphis. After each report that the train was gone he would call his wine bearer, a negro almost as huge as himself, punch him, then slake his thirst. After three days the little gray haired information clerk became tired of the daily invasion and took Siki by the scruff of the neck and threw him out of the station.
 As Mrs. Phal identified the body, unconsciously she uttered her eulogy for him. "He was a good boy," she said, "but they didn't understand him; he was full of mischief."
