

To Examine Aged Miner for Sanity

YREKA, Calif., Dec. 17.—Suffering from an aberration that he is being pursued by strangers, Peter Osterried, for more than 35 years a miner in the Cecilville region, became so violent last week that he shot at imaginary targets until neighbors became terrified and Deputy Sheriff Luther Lake and Roscoe Farnsworth brought him to

Yreka for examination for sanity. Osterried is widely known as a miner and he is thought to have acquired considerable money as the result of his operations in the Salmon river country. Not married, the aged miner has been living by himself in a cabin near one of his holdings. Following an examination here, Osterried was sent to the Napa state hospital for observation and treatment.

Wife Receives 'Other Woman' In Own Home

Says Suit Filed by Shoe Man is False

CENTRAL FALLS, R. L. Dec. 17.—(P)—A former mayor of this place is at liberty under \$10,000 bail and the woman whose affections he is charged with having alienated has been taken by his wife into their home.

Mrs. Bertha A. Jette today is standing by Charles H. Lord, named in the \$25,000 suit for her husband, Oscar A. Jette, wealthy shoe manufacturer, who she says barred her from their Pawtucket home.

With Mrs. Jette are her two youngsters. She brought them at the invitation of Mrs. Lord. The wife of the former mayor said she wanted to show by her action her faith in the father of their seven children. "The suit is without the slightest foundation," Mrs. Jette told newspaper men. "The charges are silly and absurd and I will be vindicated at the proper time."

Find Plot To Kill German Envoy Abroad

Letters Tell of Plan To Murder Stresemann

BERLIN, Dec. 17.—(P)—"That pig Stresemann must be killed," is a passage in a letter, the discovery of which led to the revelation of the plot to assassinate Germany's foreign minister.

Two German fascists named Kaldorf and Lorenz are under arrest. They are alleged to have perfected their plans to the point of providing for disguises and a getaway in motor cars and an airplane after the assassination.

That this was not the first attempt against the foreign minister was revealed by his newspaper, the Taegliche Rundschau.

On the anniversary of the assassination of Dr. Walter Rathenau (who was killed June 24, 1922) the paper says, several persons hid in the garden of the foreign minister and fired a number of shots at Dr. Stresemann, but without effect. Police who searched the garden were unable to find the criminals.

Another plot was revealed a few days before the departure of the German delegation.

Use Three Teams To Win Hoop Game

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 17.—Using three complete teams, the Willamette university basketball aggregation defeated the Monmouth Normal school team 43 to 13 on the Willamette floor here last night. The Bearcat squad showed promise of future strength but for the most part the one-sidedness of the score was due to the weakness of the teachers' aggregation. There are four veterans on the Willamette team, the only man playing on the varsity last night being Fleischer, sophomore.

The Bearcat first team piled up 33 points to the teachers' 4 during the time the first team was in the game, which was about half of each period.

Axe Only Clue to Detroit Murder

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 17.—(P)—A bloody axe lying near the body of Mrs. Marie C. Mullen, 55, real estate broker, is the clue on which police are working to solve her murder last night. Her body with several wounds in the head was found in the basement of her home.

Charles Fitzpatrick, negro janitor who reported discovery of the body, is being detained.

Want More Men on Reclamation Farms

WASHINGTON, Dec. 17.—(P)—A definite program for assisting settlers to reach reclamation projects and for their establishment thereon was discussed today at a conference of railway men and Elwood Mead, reclamation commissioner, and other officials of the reclamation service. Suggestions included legislation to permit the reclamation service to employ men on irrigation projects who will take care of the settler when he arrives and assist him to get his farm under profitable operation.

Medford Slayer's Wife Fights His Suit for Divorce

MEDFORD, Ore., Dec. 17.—(P)—Mrs. Harriet E. Huntley, whose husband Herman Huntley was acquitted of first degree murder last month for the slaying of Jesse James Gibbs, her alleged lover, yesterday filed an answer to the divorce suit her mate filed three days after the verdict.

In the answer Mrs. Huntley charges cruel and inhuman treatment, and denies that "on August 14, 1925, she gave \$69.60 of Huntley's money to Gibbs," as she avers she was

accused "in an abusive and unwarranted manner." The money, Mrs. Huntley says, was expended for household expenses and automobile tires, repairs and a horn. Mrs. Huntley asks for the custody of the two youngest children, a decree of divorce, \$20 a month maintenance money and \$100 for attorney's fees.

The Huntleys are well known in Douglas and Coos counties, where they lived for years. Miss Johnston South Miss Anna Mae Johnston plans to leave tomorrow morning for San Francisco, where she will visit for a week with friends, expecting to return home in time for Christmas.

Crippled Steamer Making Headway

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 17.—(P)—The steamer West O'Rowa is proceeding and making fair progress, says a message received today by the Columbia Pacific Shipping Company. Captain E. G. Heinric, operating manager, said that his advice from Captain Robert Wilson, master of the West O'Rowa, superceded information through Cordova, to the effect that the vessel was disabled and again adrift. The message stated that the sea had moderated and that the West O'Rowa had covered 120 miles in the day.

Mink Farming New Dorris Industry
