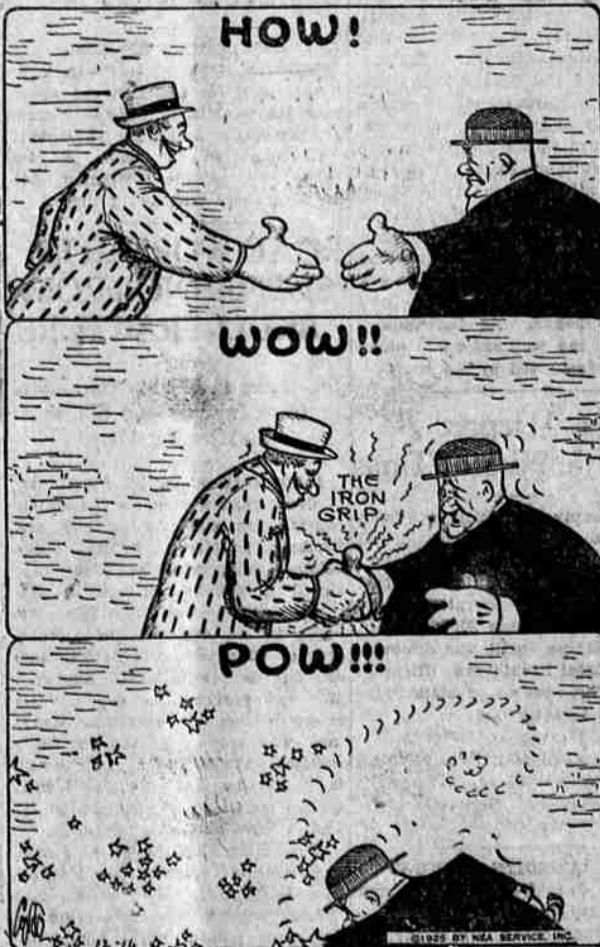
'All Serene,' View of Condition in Syria
