**GOING SOUTH**

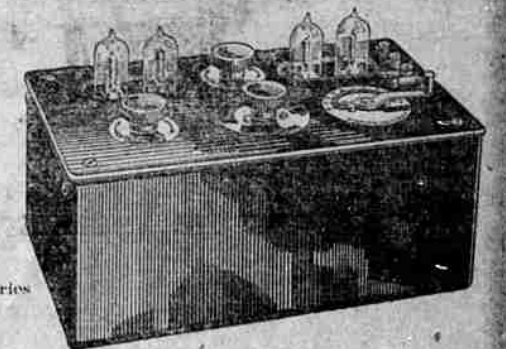
To spend their Christmas and New Years holidays in the south with their parents, Mr. and Mrs. Allan Jones will leave on Wednesday for San Francisco.
