

Ban Whiskey Use in Medicinal or Flavoring Trade

WASHINGTON, Dec. 19. (AP)—Use of whiskey, brandy, rum or gin after next February 1, in the manufacture of medicinal preparations or flavoring extracts and syrups, was forbidden today by a treasury order. Alcohol and wines can be used instead for the purposes named.

650,000 in Germany Receiving Charity

BERLIN, Dec. 19. (AP)—More than 650,000 unemployed persons in Germany are receiving public relief. An announcement issued yesterday shows that those unemployed and receiving public relief have increased from 475,000 on November 18 to 664,000 at the present time.

CHINESE FORCES AIDED BY ARMS SENT BY RUSSIA

Rifles and Light Artillery Sent to Aid Defeated Forces of Gen. Feng

REPORT HEAVY LOSSES

Two-Day Battle takes Many Lives; Report Received; Fight Christians

LONDON, Dec. 19. (AP)—The forces of General Feng Yu-hsiang, leader of the national people's army, are declared to have met with defeat at the hands of the troops of General Li Ching-Lin, civil governor of the province of Chihli, in a battle on the Yangtsun front. The losses in Feng's command are said to have been serious. The battle started Thursday night, when Feng opened with a heavy bombardment. Friday morning Feng made an assault but was repulsed with heavy losses.

A dispatch to the Daily Mail, sent from the Yangtsun front by way of Peking, says that reinforcements for Feng, having Russian rifles, Russian bayonets and quantities of Russian light artillery and mortars, have arrived.

To the north, in the Mukden sector, it is reported that a final battle is in prospect between troops of the national army and those of Marshal Chang Tso-Lin, the Manchurian war lord. Although these forces are declared to be well equipped, it is asserted that they are "lacking the will to fight."

In southern China efforts are being made by Chinese students to make successful their plan for an anti-Christian campaign during Christmas week. Publications describing Christianity as "the instrument of imperialistic encroachment" are being disseminated.

Alabama Team Starting Trip To California

Eleven in Shape For Game With Washington U.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala., Dec. 19. (AP)—With every man in the pink of condition, the University of Alabama eleven, twice champions of the southern intercollegiate conference, embarked this afternoon for the long trek to the Pacific coast where at Pasadena on New Year's day the Crimson Tide will be pitted against Washington university's football squad, champions of the Pacific coast.

The team will be accompanied by coaches, faculty members and a corps of newspaper men on its long journey which will be broken only by one stop at Grand Canyon, where a limbering up practice will be held. The team will arrive at Pasadena on Christmas eve and will hold daily practice until the game.

THIRD PARTY IS SHOWING ACTION IN NORTH DAKOTA

Farmer-Labor Group Begins Activity in Preparation for 1926 Campaign

WILL LAUNCH TICKET

Platform Demands Farmers Get Same Favors now Given Corporations

BISMARCK, N. D., Dec. 19. (AP)—A third party movement in North Dakota in preparation for the 1926 political campaign was started here last night with the formation of the farmer-labor party of this state. The organization was regarded as a skeleton affair with its final definite status probably not being decided until next February. Those who sponsored the third party idea are members of the non-partisan league. The league itself was not behind the plan.

Those who attended the meeting here adopted state and national platforms for the farmer-labor party which they hope to put on a solid national footing. They prepared to launch a ticket for the senate elections next year.

The national platform demands that the federal government give the same consideration to agricultural interests that it has given to the railroads and other corporations.

The L. C. C. was urged to reduce to pre-war levels the present freight rates on agricultural products. Repeal of the Esch-Cummins law and a plea that the railroads be publicly owned "with definite safeguards against bureaucratic control" was contained in another plank.

That the third party will be strenuously opposed by non-partisan league leaders was seen here.

Car Stolen In North Bend Found In Roseburg

ROSEBURG, Ore., Dec. 19. (AP)—Recovering a stolen car before it was misused by the owner was the accomplishment reported this morning by Sheriff Starmer.

Late yesterday afternoon a woman residing near Winston, south of Roseburg, reported a new car and a suspicious looking man hidden on a side road, a short distance off the Pacific highway. A state traffic officer was sent to the scene by Sheriff Starmer and arrested a man giving the name of Gilbert Whitlow. Whitlow, according to Sheriff Starmer, confessed that the new enclosed car he was driving had been stolen from the Morgan Garage at North Bend. Sheriff Starmer called up the chief of police at North Bend who upon investigation found that the car had been removed from the garage and had never been missed.

Sheriff Gage of Coos county instructed Sheriff Starmer to hold the suspect, stating that Whitlow was released from the Coos county jail at Coquille, only a few days ago, having been held under suspicion for alleged participation in an auto theft.

Berlenbach To Take Crack At Dempsey Crown

Weight Forces Him To Give Up Present Title

NEW YORK, Dec. 19. (AP)—Difficulty in making the 175 pound weight limit of his division and aspirations to succeed the heavyweight crown now held by Jack Dempsey may shortly compel Paul Berlenbach to relinquish his world's light heavyweight championship, declares Dan Hickey, his manager.

Berlenbach, who made his heavyweight bow several months ago by knocking out King Solomon of Panama, already is planning an active heavyweight campaign, Hickey admitted.

Before leaving the light heavyweight field, however, Berlenbach will give Harry Greb, world's middle weight champion, the next chance at his title.

Kaplan Clinches Feather Crown

NEW YORK, Dec. 19. (AP)—Louis (Kid) Kaplan's hold on the world's featherweight ring title was more secure today as the result of a convincing decision over his persistent challenger, Babe Herman, last night before 14,000 spectators in Madison Square Garden.

In spite of the fact that Kaplan's second defense of his title within four months against his most dangerous foe was marked by frequent clinches and wrestling, the contest at least cleared the atmosphere of doubt which prevailed after their first title contest last August.

The champions aggressive defensive last night, however, won him 11 of the 15 rounds, while but two were carried by Herman, with the remaining two rounds even.
