THE NEXT NATIONAL BOOM

People are speculating widely over the date of a possible collapse in the Florida real estate boom and in what part of our country the next one will occur.

The Cotton Belt extending westward to the Pacific, the climatic advantages, mountain scenery, citrus fruits and semi-tropical vegetation all point a golden index finger to the southwest which embraces an area of a million square miles extending from the Rocky mountains toward the Pacific and southward to Mexico.

Sensing this condition the city of Oakland, California, plans the expenditure of \$20,000,000 for harbor and factory facilities which will make it one of the greatest manufacturing and distributing centers in the world. Already cotton manufacturing from western grown cotton has a flourishing start there, not to mention all lines of general manufacturing, automobiles, radio equipment, etc.

STEWART'S WASHINGTON LETTER

WASHINGTON.—The fact that Vice President Dawes has to depend on a Democrat—Senator Underwood—to lead his fight for changes in the rules of the upper house of Congress tells its own story of the administration's attitude toward the proposition—and toward Dawes also.

Yet it doesn't follow, just because one of them sponsors the resolution, that the Democrats favor gag rule in the Senate. It doesn't even follow that Underwood does.

It simply suits Democratic purposes to have a Republican vice

president whooping 'er up for something a Republican administration doesn't want, since naturally this creates a disagreeable Republican situation. But when it comes actually to changing the rules, that'll be different.

Dawes undoubtedly is due to be unmercifully razed if he sticks to his present Senate policy.

The Democrats evidently have made up their minds that he'll be good raw material to work on. Senator Pat Harrison began it, even before Congress convened, with his reference to him as "the Mussolini of American politics."

And the Republicans, unless he cuts out the "Hell's Maria" stuff right speedily, are going to let the Democrats have their own sweet will with him, possibly even taking a hand in the sport semi-occasionally.

The gist of it is, that the administration and the Republican organization suspect Dawes of having undertaken to work up a boom for himself independently of their plans and wishes. They don't propose to let him get away with it.

DEARBORN, Mich.—"Airplanes will stop all warfare." He made the statement as he stood in the Ford laboratory building at Dearborn, Michigan, watching a Ford plane, bound for Chicago, disappear in the clouds. "It will take time," he continued, "but time will bring that situation about."

Must Justify Itself

"The airplane, first of all, has to justify itself by successful flights, day after day.

"One or a dozen trips from one point to another mean nothing. It must show consistent and continual mastering of the air and then—it will have the telling effect on war.

"War, heretofore, has been localized. The war makers have been able to hide behind armies and navies. With airplanes the war will be brought into the war makers' back yard.

Can't Escape Danger

"They will be made to bear the consequences of their work. They will be on 'the front' because the front will be almost anywhere and everywhere.

"There may be future wars, but they will become wars against the war makers.

"Even though the United States may be a peaceable nation, it does not represent or control the whole world. There are war makers elsewhere. They will be brought to another frame of mind by the airplane.

"You can find the whole future of the airplane in Tennyson's 'Locksley Hall.' Did you ever read it?"
