HOUSE ADJOURNS
NO VOTE TAKEN
ON POSTAL BILL

Absent Members Will be Given Opportunity to Express Themselves

WASHINGTON, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Completing work on the first of the annual supply measures, that for the treasury and post office departments, the house adjourned today for a Christmas recess without taking a final vote on the bill.

A final vote was deferred to enable members who have left the city for the holidays to be present to vote on an amendment to increase by \$500,000 the amount carried for establishment of new rural mail routes.

Before adjournment, Speaker Longworth took occasion to compliment the body on its efficient work in passing the revenue bill and practically completing one of the big appropriation measures during the short time it had been in session.

Constable Who Took Bribe Is Given Pardon

Good Record Wins Christmas Gift From Pierce

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 23.—(AP)—Release from the state penitentiary and restoration to full citizenship is the Christmas present given by Governor Pierce to Fred C. Schulte, former constable at Reedsport, Douglas county.

Schulte was convicted on a charge of accepting a bribe, alleged to have been tendered him while he was serving as constable, and in connection with prohibition law violations.

Schulte was sentenced to serve seven years in the state prison. His release comes about through a commutation of sentence to three years which Schulte has already served, enabling him to leave the penitentiary immediately.

The commutation is based on the good record made by Schulte while in the prison and his service to the state as a skilled mechanic. Some of the finest pieces of furniture at the prison are his handiwork. Also clemency was recommended by Guy Gordon of Roseburg, who as district attorney prosecuted Schulte, and by Judge J. W. Hamilton, who presided at the trial.

Storm Sweeps 150 Fishermen to Sea

TOKYO, Dec. 23.—(AP)—Twenty fishing boats containing 150 fishermen are missing in a storm which struck northern Japan yesterday. A number of houses were wrecked and forty vessels capsized.

Falling Walls Kill Volunteer Firemen

WAYNESBURG, Pa., Dec. 23.—(AP)—Four volunteer firemen were killed and five others injured, two seriously during a fire which swept the business district of Waynesburg today. A falling wall crushed the men. Several buildings were destroyed. Loss was estimated at \$1,000,000.

Wheat Price Takes Sharp Hike Upward

CHICAGO, Dec. 23. (AP)—Wheat prices shot skyward as the result of the government crop report suggesting that the United States has already shipped abroad wheat that is needed at home.
