Institutions Of State Have Surplus Funds

Five do Not Use Appropriation, Report Shows

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 6.—(AP)—Of the eleven state institutions, five showed surplus funds on January 1, a report prepared by the state board of control yesterday showed.

The state penitentiary shows that it has remaining \$183,307 of its \$350,000 appropriation, the feeble minded institution \$214,021 out of \$417,250, the training school \$125,448 out of \$216,675, the deaf school \$80,117 out of \$112,994 and the eastern Oregon hospital \$337,365 out of \$617,800.

Institutions that do not show any surplus and their balances remaining from appropriations, are:

State hospital for insane at Salem, \$432,644 out of \$387,425; Tuberculosis hospital, \$97,500 out of \$215,000; blind school, \$23,523 out of \$59,000; girls' industrial school, \$28,611 out of \$63,840; soldiers' home at Roseburg, \$26,474 out of \$75,050; employment institution for blind in Portland, \$37,822 out of millage tax receipts of \$42,355.

Ex-Chief Of Scotland Yard Denies Charge

Is Fined For Misconduct in Park

LONDON, Jan. 5.—(AP)—Sir Basil Thompson, former Scotland Yard's official, was convicted today of a charge of misconduct with a woman in Hyde Park and fined 5 pounds sterling.

Sir Basil was merely gathering data for literary work when arrested, it was testified on his behalf in the police court.

The defendant's counsel, Sir Henry H. Curtis-Bennett, declared he would call witnesses who knew of Sir Basil's intentions to write about "Communism," Hyde Park and Solicitation in the west end generally, and to get his material by visiting the park at night.

Reginald McKenna, former councillor of the exchequer and vice-admiral Sir Reginald Hall gave evidence regarding Sir Basil's character.

Sir Basil confirmed the statement that he was in the park to gather material on communism, as he had been informed that a man he wanted to hear would speak there. He was accosted by a woman, and sat down with her to get material for his book.

Marketing Plan Is Upheld by Court

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 6.—(AP)—The validity of the marketing agreement of the Oregon Growers' cooperative association, now defunct, is upheld by the supreme court today in the case of the association, as appellant, against Ernest D.
