

Frank Farmer And Keeler Are Re-Matched For Main Event At Scandia Hall On Eve Of Jan. 19

Idaho Heavyweight Declares He Will Reverse What He Considers Unfair Decision Against Him—Good Supporting Card Promised

Honestly believing he was "robbed" of the decision in his 10 round bout here a week ago with Frank Farmer, Willie Keeler, Kellogg, Idaho, heavyweight, has been re-matched with the foxy Tacoma logger, and they will battle it out on a 75-25 basis at Scandia hall on the night of January 19.

After 10 rounds of terrific battling, the referee gave Farmer the decision over Keeler, and this verdict was popular with a majority of the fans. However, from a purely fighting and boxing standpoint, it appeared that Keeler should not have received anything worse than a draw. He scored the only knockdown of the fight. He took the offensive time after time, and stopped a lot of Farmers vicious left jabs on the arms and elbow. It was a good clean fight all the way through and sent the fans home entirely satisfied with the card.

So sure is Keeler that he can take Farmer's measure in the return go, that he is offering to fight on a basis of 75 percent to the winner and 25 percent to the loser. This doesn't sound much like he is afraid of the wily veteran, and with the added purse as an incentive, he will be in there every minute to make the going as rough as possible.

Because Farmer is approximately 35 pounds lighter than Keeler, and because, perhaps, of his ancient bald head, he was a big favorite over the Idaho mauler, and probably will have the crowd with him when they crawl through the ropes for their return go.

The matchmaker is lining up a good supporting card which will be announced within the next few days. The supporting card promises to be much better than on the New Year's night card, which fell below the standard because of the last minute substitutions which were forced on the matchmaker.

Around the highways and byways of the city a lot of real interest is being manifested in the return go between these two behemoths. Keeler has plenty of supporters who think he was entitled to a draw with Farmer, and they're going to be for him just as strong as a week from next Tuesday night.

Starting today, Keeler will work out at 3 o'clock each afternoon, and Farmer will go through his paces each evening, starting at 7 o'clock. These public workouts will continue until the eve of the fight.

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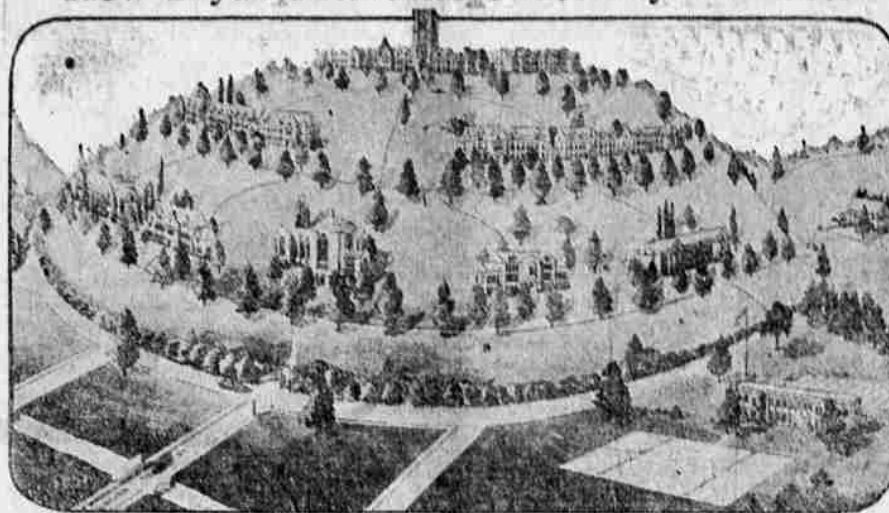


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How Bryan Memorial University Will Look
