MODERN CITY BUILT BY
BUSINESS MEN AS DIVERSION

DENVER, Colo.—(P)—A Denver
man's diversion from the cares of
his business has resulted in one of
the major attractions along the city's
mountain park drives.
From a modest beginning has
grown Turner's "Tiny Town," a
miniature village in Turkey Creek
canyon, 39 miles from here. The
"town" covers several acres, has
electric lighted streets, a real rail-
way system, a small steamship that
plys on a miniature lake as well
as amblers and mines on the hill

barns, silos and farmhouses.

OWN CONSEQUENCES**

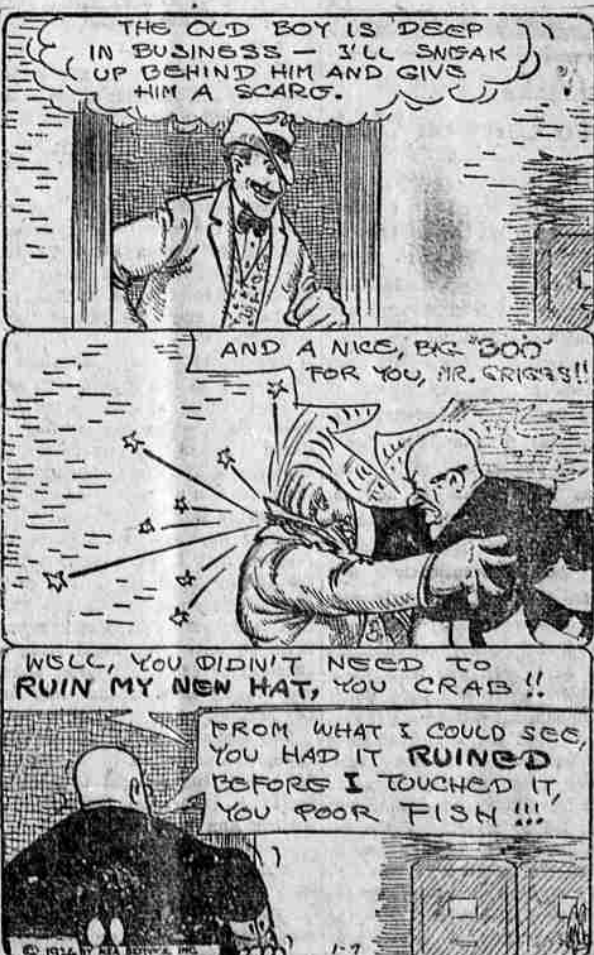
CHICAGO—(P)—Methodist mis-
